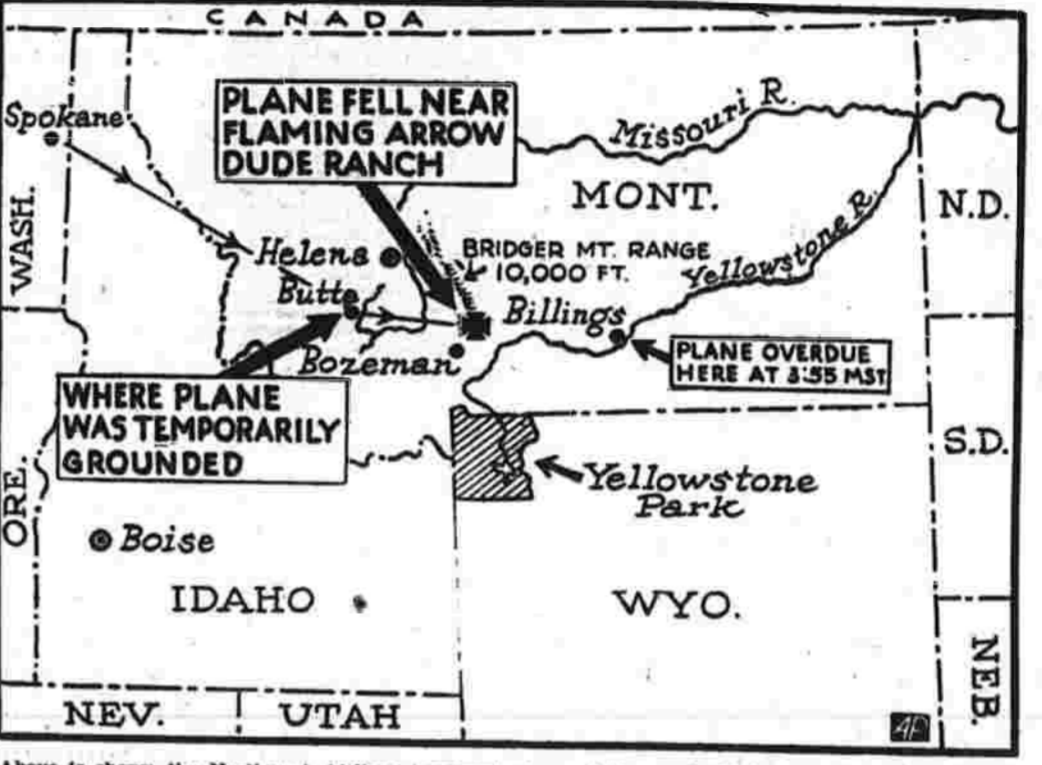

STATE'S RESERVES BEING BUILT UP

Official Reports That Potential Saving of a Million Has Been Accomplished.

Hartford, Jan. 11.—(AP)—A potential saving of more than a million dollars in the first six months of the current fiscal year is already indicated under the state's new budgetary control system.

Deputy Controller John M. Dore reported today that emergency reserves of \$1,312,008.48 have been set up out of the \$248,688.68 appropriated for the general fund of the state for the fiscal year 1937-38.

None of the \$1,312,000 can be used for any other purpose than institutions unless there is a re-estimation of the emergency reserves.

The emergency reserves do not include the state's department funds, which are not yet appropriated.

The Dore report covering expenditures and commitments as stated in the annual report prepared Dec. 31, 1937, show that \$12,700,000 of the state's general fund appropriation was allotted to the state agency.
