The brief hearing was attended by Reed, now solicitor-general, and Attorney-General Cummings.

The attorney-general praised Reed's legal ability and said the nomination of the 53-year-old Kentuckian was a "great personal satisfaction."

The Judiciary subcommittee will
put the nomination of the solicitorgeneral before the full judiciary
committee Monday. Prompt approval was expected and final Senate
confirmation was slated for early
next week.

Cummings' testimony, given a
Senate Judiciary subcommittee considering Reed's nomination to the
court, followed disclorure by Chairman Logan (D., Ky.), that only one

In a statement to the committee, Cummings outlined the nominee's career.

Starting law practice in Kentucky in 1919, Cummings said, Reed later helped organize a tobacco growers' co-operative association and served as general counsel for the Federal Farm Board.

Reed also served as an attorney for the RFC, Cummings said.

"It is a great personal satisfaction that he has been nominated for the Supreme Court," Cummings said. He said Reed's services with the Justice Department as solicitor-general "were of the highest type."






