SLEUTHS QUIZZED IN BOMBING PROBE

Charged With Wire Tapping, Had Been Watching Home Of Special Investigator.

Los Angeles, Jan. 20.—(AP)—The captain and an officer of a special police intelligence squad were ordered held today on suspicion of wire-tapping at the home of a Vice Investigator Harry Raymond, victim of a bomb explosion last Friday.

Wire-tapping is a felony in California.

District Attorney Burton Pitts issued the order to arrest Earl Kynette, acting captain of detectives, and one of his aides, Dan M. Spragg.

Five other members of Kynette's squad, Pitts said, may be arrested if they continue to refuse to answer questions in the Raymond case inquiry.

Pitts claimed he definitely had linked Kynette with a mysterious Monday surveillance of Raymond. Kynette and his men, Pitts said, were "intended" to enter and occupy a house 100 yards from the Raymond home and secretly watch the sources of the starter of the bomb.

Raymond was critically injured when he stepped on the starter of a black powder bomb.

Expected to recover.

Although more than 30 fragments of metal wounded Raymond, surgeons expect him to recover.

Pitts said he has possible clues to the source of the bomb and its probable manufacturer, and police experts were examining a Hollywood garage for fingerprints and other evidence.

The victim's wife, Mrs. Beulah Raymond, and several neighbors, Pitts declared, identified Kynette and certain officers as tenants of a "shabby" house. The neighbors saw them being hoisted in the house and subsequently strung upside.

Pitts said.

He asserted the Raymond were arranged to tap the Wilson telephone lines.

Home Deserted.

Neighbors said the house was suddenly deserted last Friday night following the bombing and no wiring was left behind, Pitts said.
