Dr. Koo's speech Dr. Koo declared the resolution was inadequate and reserved the right for China to ask the League to "adopt positive measures."

CHINESE MOVE UP THOUSANDS OF NEW TROOPS

Half Million Men Massed As Major Battle For Central China Corridor Begins; Japs March South Stalled.

Shanghai, Feb. 2.—(AP)—Chinese reinforcements moved forward by the thousands under heavy shell-fire today to plug a widening gap in southern defenses of China's lifeline corridor.

The long-awaited major engagement on the Tientsin-Peking front north of Nanjing apparently was beginning. An estimated half million Chinese troops have been massed for the struggle over the corridor, where Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek has urged his warriors to yield not a single inch.

Domestic news agency correspondents with the Japanese column moving north from Nanjing reported it had occupied Fengpi, southern keystone of Chinese position along the Tientsin-Peking railway.

The advance was made under heavy artillery and aerial bombardment after occupation of Fengpi, 16 miles east and south of Fengpi, the dispatches said.

On the Hwai river, Fengpi is only 90 miles south of Suichow, Longhai railway junction point and heart of the corridor separating Japanese conquered areas of North and Central China.

Before the new advance, Japanese captured the town of Linhai-kwan and Mingwang on their northward march. Japanese pushing south through southern Shan-tung province toward Suchow apparently were being held back.

NAZI MINISTER OF WAR HANDS IN RESIGNATION

Berlin Hears Der Fuehrer Was Not Pleased With Blomberg's Marriage; Expect Other Army Changes

Berlin, Feb. 2.—(AP)—Marshall Werner von Blomberg, minister of war, handed his resignation to Reichsfuehrer Hitler before going to court today.

There had been indications a highly reliable informant disclosed today. Officers' Corps of the army was not pleased by marriage of the 56-year-old marshal to Erica Grohn on Jan. 12, and this was followed by the reports he would relinquish his post.

Hitler and von Blomberg conferred at the war ministry on Jan. 21. The Fuehrer was seen to enter with great excitement, and later emerged appearing pale and grave.

An official announcement will not be made before the end of the week, it will be coupled, a most authoritative informant indicated, with publication of a scheme for conduct of military affairs in the future.

Von Blomberg retains the title of field marshal, there being no retirement for that rank, held normally for 10 years.

Colonel General Werner von Fritsch, commander-in-chief of the Reichswehr, who was said to have acted as spokesman for the army in suggesting the field marshal's resignation, has gone on leave and cancelled an invitation to an official dinner at his home this week.

His discharge as chief of the army will follow shortly, military circles predict. They contended he never was wholeheartedly behind the Hitler regime and it seemed apparent he was out of the running for war minister.

EDEN INVITES NEW PARLEY ON 'PIRATE' SUBS

Asks French And Italian Ambassadors To Confer; Loyalists Declare Italian Guardship Sank Enemy

London, Feb. 2.—(AP)—Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden summoned the French and Italian ambassadors to conference today to discuss emergency measures to rid the Mediterranean of the recurrent submarine menace to merchant shipping.

The menace grew from the British civil war, and resulted last fall in the Nyon accord delegating the matter to Italy's ambassador.

The Spanish government charged that the submarine was Italian with loss of ten lives, of the southeast coast of Spain on Sunday.

CONFUSION REIGNS AS 'LITTLE FELLOWS' TRY TO HOLD PARLEY

'State of War Exists', Jap Minister Hirota Informs Parliament

Tokyo, Feb. 2.—(AP)—Foreign Minister Koki Hirota told the Japanese Diet (Parliament) today: "There is no Chinese Central government recognized by Japan. A state of war exists between the two countries."

(Thus far in the seven months of Chinese-Japanese hostilities, Japan has not declared war on China.) The foreign office spokesman refused to comment on Hirota's statement, saying it spoke for itself.

Hirota's statement was the answer to a question by Takejiro Nihoaka, who declared that foreign powers with Great Britain and Russia in the lead, had been supplying China with arms and military funds for which some sort of compensation or security must have been offered.

He had asked the foreign minister, his views on "rights and interests" obtained before the outbreak of hostilities "by powers which enter into contracts with the national government of China, which they recognize but which Japan does not recognize."

Jap Naval Policy, Admiral Mitsumasa Fumimasa, naval minister, also was questioned by Parliament members. On naval policy he replied: "Japanese naval policy is independent of other naval powers' build 'million-ton warships'."

Indications increased that Japan eventually would recognize the provisional government developing in Peking as the government of China, although Japanese leaders admitted it must undergo considerable development before achieving such status.

Portland, Ore., Chief Of Detectives Also Warned To Desist Against Terrorists.

Portland, Ore., Feb. 2.—(AP)—Mayor Joseph K. Carson and Detective Capt. James J. Keegan struggled at threats against their lives today and ordered a police drive against labor terrorists continued.

With 32 men in custody, Keegan appealed to the public for information about bombings, beatings, was down-amusing and other violence.

**PRINCE PREFERRED BY NETHERLANDS**

New York, Feb. 2.—Holland is celebrating enthusiastically, but with some mental reservation, the birth to Crown Princess Juliana of a daughter who one day may be Queen.

**SWEDEN POINTS THE WAY ON SOCIAL DISEASES**

Has But Seven Cases in 100,000 And U. S. Has One In Ten; Asks All To Help Fight

Syphilis could be practically wiped out in the United States in a single generation if every victim of it sought medical attention immediately the disease manifested itself, the State Department of Health declared today in urging citizens of Connecticut to take part in the war on the disease, starting with today's second annual observance of Social Hygiene Day.

That this is no idle prediction is evidenced by the fact that Sweden has done it. In Sweden today, there are about seven syphilis infections for each 100,000 of the population. In America the ratio among adults is one in ten. And there are at least 6,000,000 cases in the United States, 20 per cent of them among boys and girls under the age of 20, half of them among young adults in the 20-30 age group. Syphilis in America kills 100,000 annually, almost three times the number killed in automobile accidents.

Years ago, there was some excuse for the prevalence of this disease. It took 400 years from the time syphilis was first found among white men before science was able to develop a successful cure. Until Wassermann gave the world the blood test for syphilis, case-finding was often difficult. Little could be done against the disease until the discovery of salvarsan or arsphenamine which is now used for treatment. But all of these advances were made 30 or more years ago!

Sweden seized them and put them to work almost at once. America did not. Yet American physicians are completely equipped with knowledge for curing syphilis just as are
