Barcelona, Feb. 4-(AP)-The British freighter Alcira, trying to run the Spanish Insurgent blockade, was bombed by two planes and sunk today 20 miles southeast of Barceiona. Her crew of 25 and an ob-server for the Non-intervention Conserver for the Non-intervention Con-trol, all British, were rescued by a Spanish government sloop and fish-ing vessels and brought to Barce-lona. A Barcelona communique said the planes came from the di-rection of Palma, Mallorca, Insur-gent naval and air base. 



Tradition says that a committee composed of General Washington, Robert Morris, and George Ross called on Mrs. Ross—"a skilliru needle woman, possessor of an upholstery shop." General Washington made a rough drawing. Then Mrs. Ross suggested a five pointed star instead of the six pointed star on the design. This suggestion was adopted by the committee,—wisel/, too! The naval committee of Congress presented to Paul Jones, high officer of the infant navy, the first official flag which was displayed on the ship "Ranger" July 4, 1777. The next November Captain Jones started across the sea to "distress the enemy." A great opportunity awaited him in February, 1778. Salling near the French fleet at Brest Road, he gave a salute and received one. he gave a salute and received one in return. This was the first salute given to our flag by a foreign power.

In April, 1778, he met the British man-of-war, the "Drake", near the Irish coast, and forced the captain to surrender after a short battle. The Drake, of greater strength, lost five times as many men as did the Banger, a signal victory, the British Ranger—a signal victory, the first of its kind! Strange as it might seem, the Ranger was called home by the Government and was captur-ed in Charleston harbor in 1780 by
