Berlin, Feb. 7—(AP)—High "8.7 Der Fuehrer left for his mountain st." (Guard Troops) sources expressed the belief today that the army shakeup Friday which ousted a number of conservative generals for ardent Nazis was not yet over.

Chancellor Adolf Hitler's departure for Berchtesgaden, his Bavarian mountain retreat, outwardly marked the end of the political givern that centralized full control of Germany's armed forces and foreign office in his hands.
