### More Private Land Buy- ing, No More Water-Ma- cadam, No More Old Plan Bridges Until 'More Study'

Hartford, Feb. 17.—(AP)—Construction of six new Merritt Parkway bridges on the basis of the old design criticized in the Hurley report will be halted "until further consideration." There will be no more water-bound macadam roads on state highways and towns will be urged to adopt the same policy regarding state and town aid roads. There will be no more private purchase of Merritt Parkway rights of way, the state to acquire most 40 remaining parcels of land by condemnation.

SISTER OF LADD TAKES THE STAND

Describes His Actions Preceding Murder; Weeps As She Gives Her Testimony

New Haven, Feb. 17.—(AP)—A sister of James Ladd, confessed slayer of a Meriden banker, was sworn in as a witness today in the Superior Court, looking on as her brother "walked for miles and miles around the house" during the week preceding the shooting killing.

Mrs. Marjorie Ladd Head said she had seen her brother's murder trial at Ladd "looked just like a corpse" after his wife had allegedly admitted to him her relations with Michael D. Leo, the victim.

"His eyes popped out and they were bloodshot," she testified, "I was alarmed about him. He was sitting there and would not talk to me."

Her testimony was punctuated by sobs and tears as she said that Mrs. Hubert, wife of the man who was arrested for the murder, had been in the room when she saw her brother's murder trial.

As the trial proceeded Mrs. Hubert described from the stand the accused man's appearance when he went to her home on a Thursday preceding the killing of Leo.

"I had to do it. I had to do it or I would have been killed," she testified.
