THIS Treaty of Sevres had left Turkey an emaciated state in 1919—robbed of his Asiatic possessions, leaving only the small peninsula of Anatolia. Mustafa Kemal Pasha, the Greek and British, had marched these men against 150,000 Greeks. At the end of the year's fighting he finally drove the Greeks into the sea, liberally burning the land of Greece. By 1923 Turkey had won back most of its lost territory and forthwith the now all-powerful Kemal took office as the president of the first Turkish republic. He immediately abolished the Caliphate and removed Sultan Mehmed VI.

Thence began a series of reforms that still shake Turkey into a modern state. Yuzum were discarded, women were unveiled and permitted to vote, a new alphabet was written, education was made compulsory for those under 40, church was separated from the state, buildings were demolished and good roads started across the nation.
