___ Washington, Feb. 23-(AP)-Secretary Ickes' call for Anglo-American unity against Fascism and Communism—avowedly made in the role of a private citizen—received immediate interpretation by Wash-ington observers today as a general expression of official bopes.

These observers pointed out that Britons who heard a radio speech by Ickes yesterday necessarily would judge these words against a background of his position as a member of President Rooseveit's Cabinet:

"The community of interest that exists between Britain and America, as well as between other people who believe in democracy, should be strengthened.
"Democracy can not live side by side in the same country with either Fascism or Communism, totalitar-fanism, either of the Right, or the Bluff, Ark., in an effort to keep the flood-swollen river within bounds.
