Peter Levine brought family waited tensely for some word of the boy's fate. The worried father, a New York lawyer, kept constant vigil at a telephone, hoping that the abductors would contact him. A reliable source indicated he had raised the entire \$350,000 demanded for safe return of the boy.

Despite the complete silence, reports persisted that the family expected a "break" today. Whether that meant a contact with the kidnapers or not is unknown.

PITTMAN URGES HUGE INCREASE IN NAVY BILL

Would Add 600 Millions To Proposed Bill; Declares U. S. Must Be Prepared To Win If War Should Come.

Washington, March 1.—(AP)—Senator Pittman (D., Nev.) suggested today a \$600,000,000 increase in the billion dollar naval building program, "in view of continued foreign preparations for war and the almost total absence of plans for peace."

Pittman, who as chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee frequently voices administration opinions, did not offer specific proposals for spending the extra money. The Navy department, he said, could work out details.

"Our government must be prepared to win," he declared, "if we are imposed upon by any government or group of governments."

Chairman Vinson (D., Ga.) predicted the House Naval Committee would have the respective bills in a day or two. Public hearings ended yesterday.

"What we all hate was and fear to have our lives cease, this is no time to indicate fear."
