SCIENTIST AHEAD OF HIS TIME

SWEDEN'S scientist, philosopher and inventor, the late Hjalmar Swenborg is honored this year on the anniversary of his birth in 1818. And looking across these centuries, history finds a pioneer even ahead of the 20th century.

Swenborg was not until the end of the 19th century that Swedenborg's voluminous writings were properly collected. Then it was seen how far ahead of his time this scholar was. His work on paleontology showed him a pioneer in this field; he had arrived at the motion of the planets and the formation of the planets and the sun long before Kant and Laplace; he wrote a lucid account of molecular magnetic theory. He was the first to employ the term of air pump and he devised a method of determining longitude at sea by observations of the moon against the stars.

Swenborg showed 150 years before any other scientist that the motion of the planets and the sun was with the respiration and not with the action and the circulation of the blood. He even anticipated modern research on the function of the pines and on theology. So the 19th century honors him on this anniversary as a Sweden by a set of three stamps, one of which is a portrait of the man.
