





Winsted, March 8.—(AP)— The Rev. E. A. Hartney praised the late Irving E. Manchester for his "courageous idealism" as he conducted funeral services at the Methodist church today for the veteran newspaperman who died here Sunday.

Besides numbers of his former associates in the newspaper profession attending the services, the Winsted Chapter of the Red Cross, of which Manchester was president, the Visiting Nurses Association and Visiting Nurses Association an Rotary Club sent delegations. the Visiting Nurses Association and the Rotary Club sent delegations.

Manchester was vice president of the Visiting Nurses Association and a charter member of the Rotary club.

The pall-bearers, all related to Manchester, were Russek, Lloyd, Randall, Seward and Albert Manchester and Arthur Olcutt. The body was placed in a vault at Forest View cemetery.

Manchester, who was 67, joined the Winsted Citizen staff after graduating from Wesleyan University in 1897. He later became its president, treasurer and managing editor and as such was the employer of the late Lou Stone who became nationally famous for his nature stories and accounts of freak happenings in the Winsted neighborhood.

Manchester retired from the Citizen in 1920 but reentered newspaper work after a lapse of three years to edit the Winsted Times. In late years he was Winsted correspondent for the Waterbury Republican.
