FEY, RUTHLESS FOE OF AUSTRIA REDS, A SUICIDE

Dollfus' Right Hand Who Drove Many to Self- Destruction Shoots Wife, Son And Self in Vienna Home.

Vienna, March 13.—(AP)—Major Paul Fey, ruthless anti-Nazi and one of the Dollfus regime's fiercest foes in the home country, today shot his wife, three-year-old son and himself in his Vienna home, it was reported today.

Fey, 47, was born in 1890 in the town of Moutier, Switzerland, and spent his early years in the United States. He was a member of the Communist party and was active in the American Communist movement.

He was a close associate of the late Joseph P. Kamp, a prominent American Communist leader. Fey was known for his fiery speeches and his uncompromising attitude against the Dollfus regime.

He was shot in his home in Vienna, Austria, on Tuesday night. The police are investigating the case and are believed to be looking for a motive.

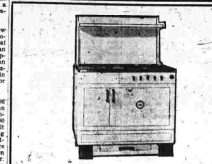
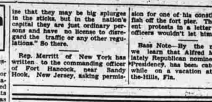

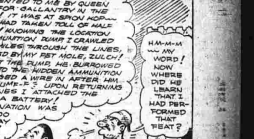
