TV A INQUIRY IS BLOCKED TODAY BY SEN. BARKLEY

Checks Bridges' Move For Immediate Probe; President Sends Message Giv- ing Cause For Dismissal.

Washington, March 23.—(AP)—Senator Barkley, the administration's floor leader, temporarily blocked today a Senate effort to authorize an investigation of the Tennessee Valley Authority.

Even before the Senate heard a scheduled message from President Roosevelt on his reasons for casting TV A Chairman Arthur E. Morgan, Senator Bridges (R., N. H.) asked unanimous consent that a resolution calling for a joint Senate-House investigation of the power agency.

In registering his objection, Barkley said there was "no question regarding the desirability of an investigation of the TVA."

He added, however, that the investigation should not be made by "loyal" legislators.

Bridges, in seeking immediate consideration of his resolution, described Mr. Roosevelt's removal of Morgan from the TVA chairmanship as "dictatorial" and "arbitrary."

"It is very apparent," he said, "that an immediate Congressional investigation should be started."

He must be remembered, that Directors David E. Lilienthal and H. A. Morgan now are in unquestioned possession of all records of the TVA. Unless there is an immediate investigation of the things to which Dr. Morgan has referred, they may be covered up, or white-washed.

The Bridges investigation resolution, of which Senator King (D., Utah) is a joint author, would set up a joint committee of five members from each House.

The President's expected message, however, cleared the way for continued consideration of the power agency.

Bridges, Barkley and Senator Norris (Ind., Neb.), "Father of the TVA," engaged in a bitter exchange over the possible personnel of a joint investigating committee.

Barkley said there was "no question" about the desirability of Congressional investigation but contended it should be participated in "by anybody who has his mind made up."

"I don't agree with your philosophy," Bridges retorted.

"I am not quite so modest as the gentlemen," Bridges continued, referring to Barkley and Norris, "of whom have said they did not want to be members of an investigating committee. I may say for myself that I would go into the hearing with an open mind. But I want to serve on the committee."

"No doubt the Senator is perfectly unbiased," Norris cut in, sarcastically.

"I'm certainly as unbiased as the Senator from Nebraska," shouted Bridges.

"The difference is I don't want to be a judge in this case," Norris said.

When Bridges asked Barkley if he thought the President had authority to discharge Morgan, Barkley said he had a "cut-throat opinion" about the matter, but no opinion that could not be modified.

Barkley asked Bridges if he approved of Arthur Morgan's refusal to give facts to the President concerning charges against other directors.

"I do," because he agreed to give those facts to Congressional investigators," Bridges said.

Norris is an angry voice, one that "if it had not been for the objections of the Senators from New Hampshire (Bridges) and Utah (King) the TVA investigation would probably be finished by this time."

The elderly Senator recalled that he had backed down on his earlier demands for a Federal Trade Commission and then a Senate inquiry, and had agreed to combine his request with that of King and Bridges.

"I surrendered," Norris said heavily, "I've gone as far as I will."

Bridges interjected that he had included his own specification for the inquiry but left out 23 charges made by Bridges and King.

"They were insulting," Norris countered, "like saying 'Will you stop stealing from the TVA? Answer yes or no or 'Will you stop besting your wife? Answer yes or no.'"

No issue intended, the Senator, Bridges replied. We do have some convictions, but that we do not intend to surrender to him or anyone else.

Asks Labor Leaders To Meet Him In Parley Over Speeding Of Armament; "No Commitment" Policy.

London, March 23.—(AP)—Prime Minister Chamberlain today sought support of British labor for speeding up the country's rearmament program. At the same time he said before his ministers for approval a policy of "no new commitments" abroad.

Chamberlain asked the General Council of the Trades Union Congress to meet with him tonight at No. 10 Downing street.

He took negotiations with labor leaders into his own hands after a sign policy statement he will make in Commons tomorrow. He was expected to tell organized labor that "a cabinet" that a new quickening of rearmament must parallel Britain's course of action in the troubled international situation.

Already the prime minister has warned the country that the five-year rearmament program will cost more than the £2,000,000,000 annually announced.

Political commentators believed Chamberlain's objective in his "no new commitments" policy—which he asked the cabinet to approve unanimously—primarily was this: Britain would work to build her own defenses, but would not enter into any new alliance which could drag the nation into war, unless the demand was actually made with armed aggression, direct or indirect.

CZECHS NOW FACE POLITICAL CRISIS

More German Parties Are Beginning To Join Nazis; Expect Changes In Cabinet

Prague, March 23.—(AP)—Czechoslovakia faced a new political situation today with German parties hitherto outside the Nazi ranks climbing on to the bandwagon of Konrad Henlein, leader of the Republic's Nazi Germans.

The resignation of Karel Zakopik, representing the German Christian Socialist party in the cabinet as minister without portfolio, was expected by tomorrow.

Political observers envisioned a transition cabinet entirely of Czechs and Slovaks, which would attempt to make a new understanding with Henlein's Rosteln-German party and its allies.

Of 500 seats in the Chamber, Henlein's party has controlled 42. To this number he can add seats of five German-Agriculturalists who joined his party yesterday and two independents who vote with Henlein on all German issues.

Others May Join.

Zakopik's expected withdrawal was taken to signify the German Christian Socialist party also was ready to move over to the Henlein camp, although it might retain its separate existence.

Six deputies of this party would bring Henlein's potential strength in the Chamber to 53, making the party the largest in the Chamber.

Its namesake would be the Czech Agrarian party with 46 seats.

However, the government at present controls 143 Czech and Slovak deputies in the Chamber, plus 11 German Socialists who may decide to withdraw from the cabinet but continue to support the government.

There are 71 Chamber members from the German-Agriculturalists, the Henlein party, including 30 Czech or Slovak parties.

POPE MAKES APPEAL TO STOP AIR BOMBINGS

Asks Gen. Franco To Moderate Attacks On Civilians In Barcelona; Britain And France Also Made Pleas.

Vatican City, March 22.—(AP)—Pope Pius has made two appeals to urge moderation in the air bombing of the civilian population in the Spanish civil war.

The first appeal was made to Generalissimo Francisco Franco to moderate his attacks on Barcelona, the Vatican newspaper, disclosed today.

The second appeal was made to the Pope to join in appeals to Franco after last week's terrible bombings of Barcelona, the governmental capital, in which at least 787 persons were killed.

Monday Secretary of State Hull expressed a "sense of horror" at the Barcelona slaughter.

Benton Harbor, Mich., March 23.—(AP)—Two South Bend, Ind., men and an unidentified young woman were killed shortly before midnight when their four-seat plane crashed into a grassy field near the airport.

As the plane fell in a water-filled ditch, the woman's body was thrown clear of the burning wreckage.

The bodies were brought into Benton Harbor at 3:30 this morning.

Federal and state aviation investigators were on their way here for an inquiry.

PRESIDENT CALLS ON SOUTH TO INCREASE PURCHASING POWERS

Here Is Complete Text Of President's Speech At Gainesville, Ga.

Vienna, March 23.—(AP)—Authoritative quarters issued a long list of denials today over foreign reports of alleged panicky fleeing among Austrians since union with Germany. One denial strongly rejected rumors of thousands of suicides since the Nazi accession to power.

The statement said that from March 12 to 22, 26 persons committed suicide in Vienna, where, with the change in the political situation in Austria.

Austrian bishops enjoy full liberty, another denial stated, emphasizing there is no reason to take steps against a single one of them.

The statement added that only two members of former Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg's cabinet were under protective custody.

CRAIG OUTLINES U. S. ARMY NEEDS

Washington, March 23.—(AP)—General Main Craig, Army chief of staff, has advised the House Appropriations committee that an expenditure of \$1,000,000,000 will be necessary "to bring the army into position to respond effectively to an emergency."

"Bolstering" the Navy while permitting weakness to exist in the army, he said, "will not be effective in a defense system where both forces are vital."

Testifying at hearings on the military appropriation bill approved today by the Appropriations committee, Craig said the \$1,000,000,000 would be needed to "provide for the shortage in standard equipment, including transportation, including clothing, weapons, and ammunition for a force of 1,000,000 men."

By using wartime substitutes and by eliminating many unnecessary items, Craig explained that the War Department has a "protective mobilization plan" which involves the accumulation of essential items to meet the requirements of two field armies of 500,000 men each.

The first objective of the plan is the immediate mobilization of 400,000 men. They would include the regular army now 162,000 men, and National Guard, plus a large number of recruits.

The second objective is the additional mobilization of 238,000 men.

Tells Audience In Georgia National Progress And Prosperity Are Being Retarded By "Selfishness On The Part Of A Few," Declares Wages Are Far Too Low In Southern States.

Gainesville, Ga., March 23.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, in a speech that surprised many of his hearers, called on the industrial south today to increase wages and buying power and asserted that national progress and prosperity were being retarded chiefly by "selfishness on the part of a few."

While several opponents of the administration wage-hour bill in his outdoor audience, the Chief Executive declared bluntly that Georgia and the lower south must "face the fact"—that wage earners in the entire area "get wages which are far too low."

He said the good things that come from higher wages and purchasing power would be covered to the south "if we oppose progress—if we believe in our hearts that the Federal system is still the best system."

"When you come down to it," he added, "there is little difference between the Fascist system and the Fascist system. If you believe in the one, you believe in the other."

The President spoke to a large crowd in dedicating "Roosevelt Square" a civil center now being built on the ruins of a tornado two years ago with the help of Federal funds.

His outspoken views on wages brought private expressions of surprise from several National Legislators in the audience.

Where the city's business district and some of its residential area lay in wreckage two years ago when the tornado struck, the President passed through here today there were glistering new buildings and residences.

The tornado killed more than 200 in this city of 10,000 population.

A hand barrel and gun fired a salute as the President left his train to get into a motor car with Governor E. D. Rivers of Georgia and Mayor Pierpont Brown of Gainesville for a word from the railway station to the speakers' stand in the square.

Thousands On Streets

The President rode through streets lined with thousands of cheering people, waving American flags.

Governor Rivers, extending the state's welcome, said Georgia was behind the New Deal administration 100 percent.

Mr. Roosevelt then declared proudly that he was being retarding by a "selfish" minority who believe in a "different type of government," one little thought to the "one hundred million and ill housed, and ill clothed and ill housed," and regard balancing the budget as more important than appropriating "for relief."

"This nation," he said in talking his audience back to the Harding, Coolidge and Hoover regimes, "will never permanently get on the road to recovery if we leave the methods and the processes of recovery to those who owned the government of the United States from 1921 to 1933."

Hitting at his critics in Congress, he said the "selfish" few had the same type of mind "as those who vote against legislation to help social and economic conditions, proclaiming loudly that they are for the objectives but do not like the methods and then fall victim to the offer a better method of their own."

Then turning to conditions in "this my other state the President spoke in vigorous language against low wages and low buying power. Many in the audience believe he was referring to opposition to the wage-hour bill by many southern Congressmen.

Small Purchasing Power

"The purchasing power of the millions of Americans in this whole area is far too low," he said. "Most men and women who work for wages in this whole area get wages which are far too low. On the present scale of wages and therefore on the present scale of buying power, the south can not and will not succeed in establishing successful new industries."

BRIDGEPORT PLANS NEW HEALTH TEST

Would Have Couples Contemplating Marriage Undergo Examination.

Bridgeport, March 27.—(AP)—The Bridgeport Board of Health is advocating enactment of an amendment to Connecticut's present premarital "blood-test" law to include a complete physical examination.

At a meeting of the board last night, several members said the present law was "inadequate," because the Wasserman test now required of all couples seeking a marriage certificate would not detect numerous communicable diseases which a general physical examination would.

The board voted unanimously to recommend that the State Department of Health advocating the proposed amendment.

WOULD BE TOO COSTLY
Hartford, March 27.—(AP)—Proponents of the 1935 pre-marital "blood test" law decided that a complete physical examination would be too costly for most couples about to be placed in the hands of a state commissioner of health, said today in commenting on the action of the Bridgeport Board of Health in proposing an amendment to include a complete physical examination.

If properly done, the commission said, the State Department of Health would be able to conduct an examination of the blood of a man and a woman for 15 minutes but of an hour or the fee for such an examination would be prohibitive in many cases.

This fact was recognized when the proponents of the "blood test" law were met by Senator Harvey C. Ostrom, said today in commenting on the proposed amendment.
