BRITISH LABOR HOLDS KEY TO **EMPIRE'S PLANS**

Union Leaders Placed In Forefront Of Efforts To Back Chamberlain's Word With Guns And Airplanes.

London, March 25.—(AP)—Bri tain bent renewed energy today toward mighty rearmament—"first priority" of Prime Minister Chamberlain's foreign policy.

Chamberlain yesterday warned Britain she might have to ngnt, even though in his long-awaited pronouncement of policy in Central Europe he refused to bind the nation but the streams rose again while ice piled up at bends and bridges.

"Where peace and war are concerned, legal obligations are not alone involved and if war were to break out it would be unlikely to be confined to those who have assumed such obligations," he declared. Picturing rearmed Britain as a sentinel of world peace, Chamberlain said all else was accondary to immediate rearmament on a wartime scale.

Labor leaders were placed in the forefront of the revived effort to weigh Chamberlain's words with guns and planes.

They were the General Council of the Trade Union Congress (Union workers), the National Executive Committee of the Labor Party (Political organization composed mostly of union workers) and the Executive Committee of the Pajliamentary Labor Party (Labor Party adherents, both Union and non-finion, who are members of Parliament.)
