MARSHAL GOERING IS NOW IN AUSTRIA FOR HIS CAMPAIGN

Nazi No. 2 Leader Starts Campaign For Approval Of German Annexation; Cheers Welcome Arrival.

Vienna, March 26.—(AP)—Field Marshal Hermann Wilhelm Goering, chesty No. 2 Nazi, entered Vienna triumphantly today to campaign for 100 per cent approval of German annexation of Austria.

Happy waving his marshal's baton, Goering arrived in a special eight-car train drawn by two locomotives which chattering Viennese said was "just like our Hermann."

Goering hastily inspected the German warplanes drawn up at Aspern Airport and then drove through Vienna, apparently pleased with the touch of Austrian familiarity in hailing him as "our Hermann."

Adolf Hitler's chief lieutenant at a mass meeting tonight was expected to announce his economic program to fit newly absorbed Austria into Germany's four-year plan of which he is chief.

REDS TAKE OVER MEETING OF BUND

Trenton Anti-Nazis Howl Down Nazi Speakers And Communists Start A Rally

Trenton, N. J., March 26.—(AP)—Their "Hells" drowned by the shouts of an anti-Fascist demonstration, solemn-faced members of the German-American Bund retreated from a frustrated rally early today under a barrage of heckles and catcalls.

Gathered at Hill Hall—named for the owner, John Hill, not the Nazi shill—the Bund members allowed unsuccessfully to retain control of the meeting as an unruly audience converted it into an attack on the Bund and Fascism.

The meeting was scheduled as a membership drive for a Bund branch but Gustave William Kuntze, national Bund organizer, was unable to speak one sentence before the anti-Fascist demonstrators.

Reds Capture Meeting. Hissed and booed, Kuntze left the speakers' stand, and when the Bund chairman announced in resignation that "we'll try again later on a man and a fact," the Communist party, sprang to the stage and took over the session.

Gray told the audience that the "beginning of the end" was at hand and called a dozen people to speak. They all attacked the Bund.

A sprinkling of women and 35 police officers in the crowd of 300 which filled the hall to capacity.

The police, assigned by City Manager Paul Morton, who said he mentioned the meeting on condition that religious and racial issues would be avoided, said another crowd of 3,000 gathered outside the hall.

No Disorder. Forty other policemen arrived with a police ambulance but there were no disorders. The crowd dispersed quickly when the anti-Fascist meeting ended.

Happiest of all involved was Hill, owner of the meeting room. He reported that the Bund members had paid \$10 for the hall, the anti-Fascists paid another \$10 to continue the meeting under their auspices, and a number was consumed in unusual quantities at his adjacent barroom.

Detectives said, said the 65-year-old woman had been hanged with a rope with the knot around her neck.

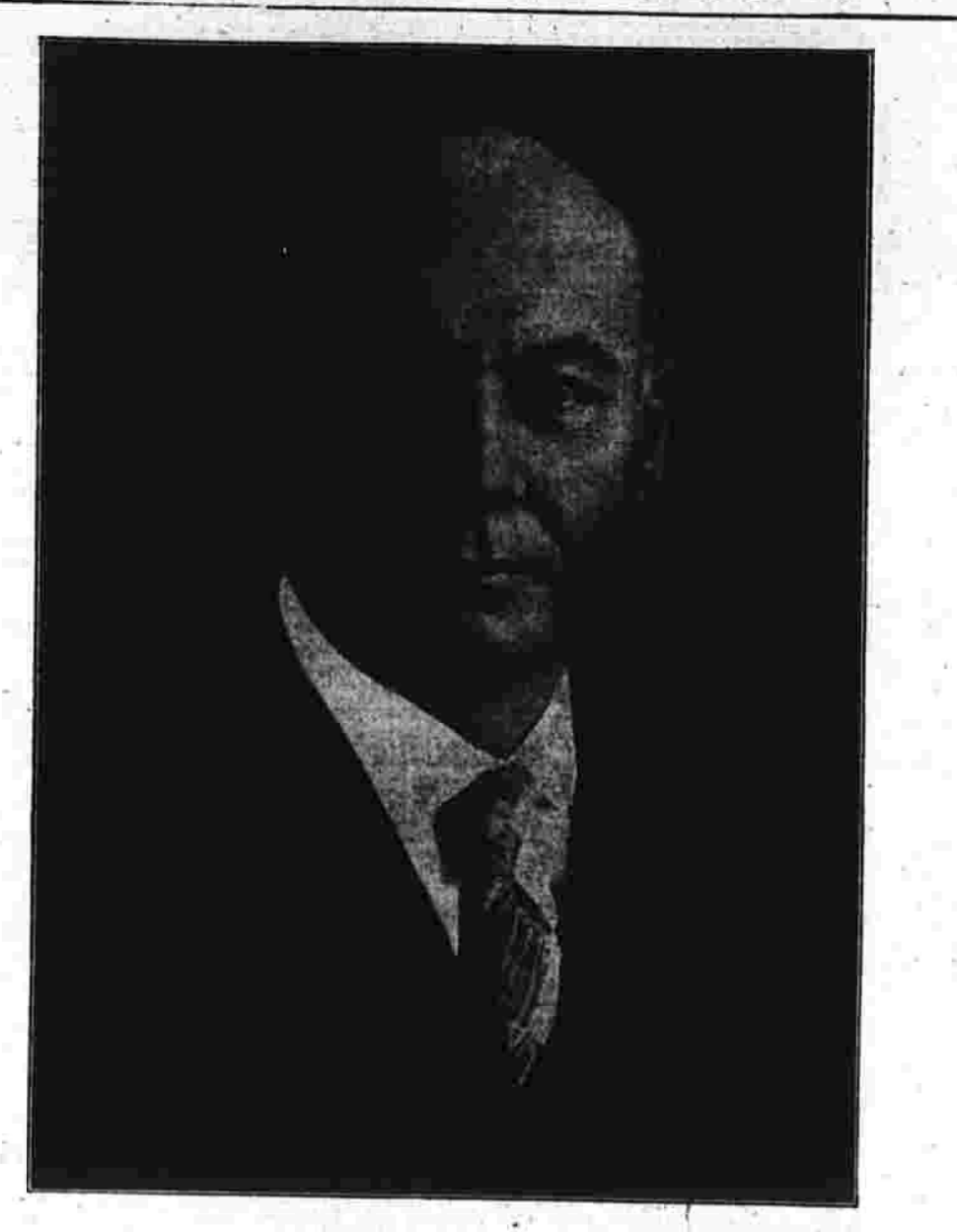

EUROPE FAVORS PLAN TO ASSIST REFUGEES

Liberal And Democratic Nations To Study Proposal Made By United States And Promise Co-operation

London, March 26.—(AP)—The United States' proposal that European and American governments cooperate in assisting political refugees, which will meet to adjust differences between the Senate and House bills.

The bill, which already has passed the House, also is expected to encounter heavy going in the Senate, although most observers expect its eventual approval. Many House members are opposed to the administration's foreign policy.

Leaders agreed that the Wagner and Hour bill, which administration has introduced in the House, is a 50-50 chance of enactment at this session.

Through this action, the United States has given a timely and courageous lead to the world. Our government has promised a speedy reply. We hope it will be one of full cooperation and that all other governments invited will show the same readiness.

"It is a fact of prime importance that the United States has not wanted his hands of the refugee problem as a European affair, but has spoken the mind bluntly in terms that amount to a measure of rebuke for the Nazis."

To Take Up Subject. The British government promised to give its immediate attention to the proposal, which Secretary Hill declared would be given the highest priority.

The French press gave prominent display to the story and the government said it would send a reply to Hill a favorable reply soon.

Switzerland was counted among the most ardent countries to be asked to assist refugees have been sent across its borders for days. Scandinavian countries gave sympathetic attention to the United States' suggestion.

GERMANY TO KEEP WHAT IT ANNEXES

Hitler Warns World That No Power Can Induce Him To Leave His Chosen Path.

Koenigsberg, Germany, March 26.—(AP)—The world should warned today that Reichschancellor Hitler had set his course and no power in the world could induce him to leave his chosen path.

The German chancellor launched his nationalist-plebiscite tour in the east today, his first public appearance since his return yesterday with the firm-vowed assertion:

"What we once possess we will never again relinquish."

Nazi party big wigs joined the Führer today and to campaign to convince the masses that his action of March 13—resulting in Austrian union with Germany—was the fulfillment of a thousand-year-old dream.

Hitler himself was scheduled to speak again tonight at Leipzig, and in Berlin Monday.

Silent on Next Steps. In his Koenigsberg speech Hitler dropped no hint of his next move, but his remarks approving direct action were seen with significance in this Baltic region, midway between Germany and Poland.

He especially mentioned neither of these territories, nor Chamberlain's speech.

FIVE MILLIONS IN HUGE FRENCH DEMONSTRATION

Rebels Drive Loyalists Out Of The Aragon

Paris, March 26.—(AP)—The General Confederation of Labor of 8,000,000 French workers ordered a demonstration today to back its industrial strikes and political demands with a show of numerical strength. Posters protesting the "diabolical prolongation of the tragedy" in the front lines, fell into the hands of the police.

The government of Premier Leon Blum, who draws much support for his People's Front ministry from the labor movement, attempted to restrain his own supporters by organizing a series of conferences of workers and employers to draft new union contracts and cut short the strikes.

Premier Blum barely averted a ministerial crisis yesterday when the cabinet voted to accept the financial measure. But deputies in the Chamber predicted peace with the upper house would last only until the Chamber's next meeting.

The strike movement remained static, with 26,720 workers still on strike in the automobile and metal industries, two brake factories, a plane factory at Issy les Moulinaux and minor metal works.

Strikes which first were called at Paris and Lille to prevent what was declared a rightist plot to overthrow Blum and substitute a dictatorial "public safety" government, were quickly put down in some of the largest cities, took on a social tinge with demands for concessions from employers.

Among these demands were new collective contracts. These demands were due in part to the disquieting dual problem of staunch labor opposition to his foreign policy and the necessity of getting concessions from employers.

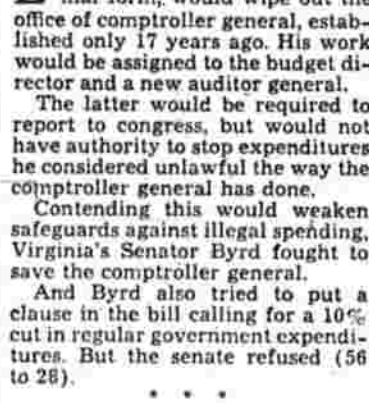

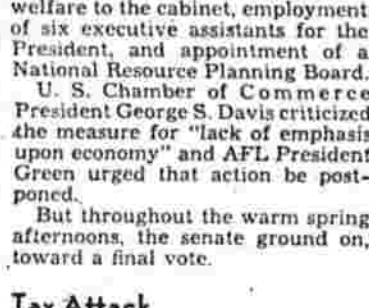
