

COL. HOUSE IS DEAD; WOODROW WILSON'S AIDE DURING WAR

Represented President At European Parleys; One Of Signers Of Treaty Of Versailles; Had Been Long Ill.

New York, March 28.—(AP)—Col. Edward M. House, internationally known as a close advisor to President Woodrow Wilson during the trying World War era, died today after a long illness. He was 79 years old.

Several weeks ago that he was "falling steadily" and that death was only a matter of time. He was suffering from a complication of ailments and had last week had another relapse.

Only members of his family, including the widow, were with him when he died. His daughter, Mrs. Gordon Auchincloss, and her husband also were there.

For many years Colonel House was active in affairs of the Democratic party. His climax of this activity when he became the official representative of President Wilson to European governments in 1914, 1915 and 1916.

In 1917, President Wilson appointed Col. House to gather and organize data to be used at the essential peace conference, and he served as special representative of the conference of presidents and foreign ministers, held in Paris, Nov. 29, 1917, to effect a more complete coordination of the activities of the cabinet.

Member Of War Council
He again represented the President in the Supreme War Council at Versailles, Dec. 1, 1918, and on Oct. 7, 1919, he was designated as the President's representative to the League of Nations.

Three Young Men Die In The Chair
First Triple Execution In Four Years In Keystone State; Stories Of Crimes.

Bellefonte, Pa. March 28.—(AP)—Three young men who met for the first time in the prison's death house died within 15 minutes today, the first triple execution in Pennsylvania in four years.

They were Ralph Hawk, 21-year-old Franklin county farmer convicted of the "torch staying" of his neighbor's mother and daughter and two desperadoes, Fred Reibald, 27, and Albert Gregg, 32, both of Philadelphia.

The heavy-set, black-haired Hawk was the first to die. He walked steadily to the chair. He was "ready to die" and slightly watched the "trap" as it closed. He was pronounced dead three minutes later. Gregg followed quickly.

Reibald, the Philadelphia "top right hand", swagged into the room between two guards, glared around the chamber and called out: "So long, warden. Good luck to you. That's all."

The vote was accepted as a test of sentiment on final passage of the bill which would give the President wide powers to reorganize executive departments and redistribute agencies.

Washington, March 28.—(AP)—The Supreme Court today gave government a major victory today by holding constitutional provisions of the Public Utility Holding Company Act requiring interstate holding companies to register with the Federal Reserve Board.

Justice Hughes delivered the decision to which Justice McReynolds dissented.

In another government victory, the court today gave the National Labor Relations Board authority to issue orders in the fruit packing industry.

CONGRESS TO SCAN HUNGARY'S OFFER

Will Pay Every Cent Of Her War Debt If The Interest Charges Are Eliminated

Washington, March 28.—(AP)—President Roosevelt will send to Congress today, without comment, other than for "most careful consideration," Hungary's proposal for settlement of its debt to the United States.

Hungary offered last Feb. 23 to pay the debt, arising from post-war relief aid, "100 cents on the dollar," but asked to be freed of obligations to pay any interest.

The original debt was \$1,685,000. Hungary has paid \$478,000 in principal and interest, leaving the total obligation \$1,207,000, to be paid in 30 annual, no-interest installments.
