SCHMIDT, RUSS POLAR LEADER, UNDER CHARGES

Soviet Council Accuses The North Sea Route Admin- istration Of Criminal Activ- ity In Ice Breaker Mess.

Moscow, March 28.—(AP)—The government said today that "criminal, anti-Soviet activity of wreckers" was found in the Northern Sea Route Administration which is headed by Dr. Otto Schmidt, who directed last summer's Polar flights to America and Polar weather observations by four Russian scientists. Without naming Dr. Schmidt, the Council of the People's Commissars, which is equivalent to the cabinet, adopted a resolution severely blaming the Sea Route Administration for the perilous position of Soviet ice breakers and ships drifting helplessly in the Arctic.

The resolution found the work of the Northern Sea Route in 1937 "unsatisfactory" and called for a detailed report by April 15.

The specific criticism dealt with the fact that almost the entire ice breaker fleet, and nearly half of the freighters that ply the northern route and were caught in the ice last autumn, are "exposed to imminent danger."

The resolution attributed "blunders" to the "inactive and concealed attitude of the Sea Route Administration."

The resolution obviously was prompted by the plight of three ice breakers conveying ships which have been drifting toward the Polar basin the past five months.

It was the first time the Northern Sea Route, with the picturesque bearded Dr. Schmidt, one of the foremost official heroes of the Soviet Union in command, has been publicly criticized.

The N. S. R. not only has charge of the great Soviet program for settlement and economic development of the Arctic reaches but also supervised such spectacular feats of exploration as the flight over the North Pole to America in 1927, and the drift of the four Polar explorers.

Pageants Promoted.—The ice floes drifted into the Greenland Sea when they were rescued by a Soviet aerial-ship expedition Feb. 19. The ice floe commander, during eight months of taking daily weather observations was Ivan Paparin. He has been appointed first assistant to Schmidt in management of the N. S. R.

HOOVER STICKS TO BELIEF WAR UNLIKELY SOON

Home From Europe Former President Expects Arms To Result Only In Change In The Balance Of Power.

New York, March 28.—(AP)—Former President Herbert Hoover came home from Europe today with seven or eight new honorary degrees, fifteen or eighteen new medals and the conviction that a general war is not imminent in Europe.

Hoover, in a quiet, unassuming way, was the guest of honor at a luncheon given by the National Association of Manufacturers in a two-month tour of four European countries. It was his first trip abroad in 19 years, and smiling quietly, he confessed he had found the continent "changed."

The Normandy, on which the former President arrived, reached Quarantine in the lower bay about midnight and dropped anchor for the night. Hoover came ashore, however, in a cutter. In the tiny lounge he had a pipe, and smoking quietly, he let the pipe go out and began talking.

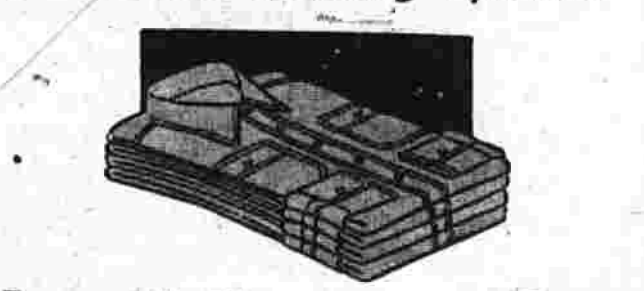
