Bucharest. March 30—(AP)—The Maniu's now inactive Peasant party government headed by the Patriarch Miron Cristea resigned at noon today for reorganization. The Cristea Cabinst was formed Feb. 11 following dismissal of the ministry of Octavian Goga by King Carol.

Sixty-nine-year-old Cristea Patriarch of the Rumanian Orthodox church, was commissioned by King Carol to form a new government and it was expected the formalities would be completed before evening. It was stated at the palace that Rumania's Cabinet of "old men" had served its purpose and that, at the request of many members of the ministry, the King was gathering new leaders about him.
