Senator Bridges Declares
The Party Should Take
That As Its Rallying Cry.

A Bangor, Me., March 31.—(AP)—U. S. Senator H. Styles Bridges (R., N.H.) summoned Republicans today to battle for decentralization of Federal government and to wage a party war on President Roosevelt and his new deal.

Decentralizing State Republican convention Bridges declared the party should take the principle of decentralization as its rallying cry and "blast" it from the "nation's house tops."

He "revised" all his works, he said, "until he was satisfied that they were not only correct but also that they were being read by the people."

Open season is on the new deal from now on," Bridges, pungently criticizing "Roosevelt's economic," and "Roosevelt's depression," said that "events which followed the election of 1933 have convinced me that the new deal is a 'new deal' in name only."

Declaring the 1938 election was "a new chapter," Bridges said that "the new deal is a 'new deal' in name only."

Pointing out the Republican party polled between 19 and 20 million votes in 1936, Bridges said "this year we can and will do better, because Roosevelt is vulnerable and his party is being torn apart by the seeds of discontent."
