

### SEE HUGE ARMS RACE IN U. S. BRITISH ACTION

#### Foes Of Big Navy Assert Escalator Course Is Sure To Start Unlimited Naval Building Through World.

Washington, April 2.—(AP)—Congressional foes of a "big navy" asserted today that invocation by the United States and Great Britain of the "escalator" clause in the London naval treaty would bring almost unlimited world naval building. "The fact the preliminary announcement of a world wide naval race," declared Senator Clark (D., Mo.), consistent opponent of large naval appropriations, "has been made public last night that they would disregard the London treaty's limitation of 35,000 tons on the size of battleships."

Both based their action on the refusal of Japan to disclose whether she intends construction of larger vessels. The Japanese had been reported building a 42,000-ton battleship.

The treaty contained an "escape" clause whereby signatories might renounce any obligation to limit the 35,000-ton limit if another nation built larger ships.

France, third signatory to the treaty, announced she would continue to adhere to the 35,000-ton limitation "so long as no continental power departs from that standard," presumably referring to Germany and Italy.

Informed officials said that the Navy might begin drafting specifications for a super-dreadnaught within the next few weeks, but that it probably would be at least five years before such a craft could be completed. The cost of a 42,000-ton battleship has been estimated from \$40,000,000 to \$100,000,000.

#### 3 BILLION FOR CANALS

"If we build these large battleships," he said, "we won't be able to get them through the Panama canal. That means that we'll have to spend a billion dollars building a canal through Nicaragua and another billion to make the Panama canal a sea-level route."

Clark, chairman of the Senate Inter-oceanic Canals Committee, said administration leaders had discussed such proposals with him. Chairman Walsh (D., Mass.), of the Senate Naval Affairs Committee, said, "I approve of the position and policy taken in this matter. If we are to expand our navy, we want to build the biggest and best naval craft that science can develop."

### JAPANESE ATTACKS ARE HURLED BACK

#### Chinese Rush New Mechanized Units Into The 20 Days Battle On The Canal

Shanghai, April 2.—(AP)—The Chinese hurled new mechanized units into the battle raging at Tientsin on the south Shan-tung front today.

The city on the Grand Canal stands in the way of Japan's offensive against the Longhai railway, vital transportation artery of central China.

The walls of Tientsin were blasted into ruins and mud houses were reduced to dust, but the stubbornly-resisting Chinese, who for 20 days have blocked all Japanese thrusts at the rail line, were still holding.

### STRIKERS RUN POWER PLANTS IN WIDE AREA

#### C. I. O. Union Takes Over Six Serving Many Michigan Cities, Promise No Inconvenience; Parley Is Called

Jackson, Mich., April 2.—(AP)—Electric and gas service continued without interruption today despite seizure of six strategic plants of the Consumers Power Company in Southern Michigan by employees belonging to a Committee for Industrial Organization.

The company said the union demands included upward revision of wages, the union said it sought assurance there would be no reduction of service.

Gov. Frank Murphy, concluding a Florida vacation, upon being notified of the situation, called representatives of the company and the C. I. O. to meet with him in Detroit Monday morning.

The union took over a hydro-electric plant near Saginaw; two electric substations in Flint and one in Bay City, and gas plants in Flint and Lansing.

No strikes were reported. Union employees and foremen were requested to leave and pickets were on duty outside some of the seized plants. Only union members were permitted to enter the plants.
