

EXPECT TO PASS BUREAU BILL LATE IN WEEK Administration Friends Content, Antis Turn To Attempts To Amend; Seek Many Changes In Bill.

Washington, April 8.—(AP)—Republicans and revolting Democrats virtually abandoned hope today of killing the government reorganization bill in the House, but concentrated instead on trying to ride it with amendments. Although granting that concessions made by administration leaders, probably would swing enough votes to pass the measure, the opponents sought to strike out three more controversial provisions.

These provisions would create a new Welfare Department, substitute a single administrator for the three-man Civil Service Commission and create an auditor-general to check up on Federal expenditures. Elimination of these sections would strip the bill of everything except general presidential authority to reorganize and revise Federal agencies, and permission to employ six White House assistants.

Under a compromise by administration lieutenants, the President's reorganization orders could be overridden by a majority vote of Congress. Various agencies including the Veterans Bureau, could not be incorporated in other departments. Democratic backers of the bill were so confident of eventual victory that they made no attempt to complete a poll to determine how the members would vote.

Representative Rayburn of Texas, Democratic floor leader, declared in a radio address last night that legislation would have been passed months ago had it not been made so unpopular by the demonstration of hostility by the President's foes.

"There is no politics in the measure," he said, "no departure from the principles or policies of the republic, no danger to any of our institutions and no thought except to simplify the processes of government and to make more easily workable machinery that has become clogged and unworkable."

FRENCH PREMIER'S BID FOR SWEEPING POWERS STARTS RIOTOUS SCENE



Starts Such An Uproar in Chamber Of Deputies That Herriot Is Forced To Suspend The Session—Foes Charge Blum Proposal Was Designed To Start An Economic Revolution.

Paris, April 8.—(AP)—Premier Leon Blum's demand for sweeping powers to control France's economic life by decree today threw the Chamber of Deputies into such an uproar that its President, Edouard Herriot, suspended the session.

This came half an hour after debate began on the Premier's financial program, which many political observers predicted would cause his downfall. Jean Montigny, independent deputy, charged the Blum bill—conferring decree powers until July 1—was designed to start "a veritable social and economic revolution."

"That is the way the German Republic perished, too," Montigny shouted. "Down With Herriot!"

Leftist deputies Blum's supporters rose in a body and advanced on the Premier, shouting "Down With Herriot!"

New York, April 8.—Discovery of the cause of coronary thrombosis, the heart trouble of high tension workers, was reported to the American College of Physicians today.

It comes from too much anxiety, a chemical which the nerves produce to make muscles move when the "motor center" of the brain transmits the impulse for movement.

Dogs at the Department of Medical Research, University of Toronto, were given coronary thrombosis by the simple expedient of injecting into their blood daily small quantities of atropine chloride.

The atropine chloride, which has been used for many years in the treatment of certain nervous system conditions, was given to the dogs in the form of a solution.
