

Hartford, April 14.—(AP) — The state board of fisheries and game announced today it had completed its work and that if you are an angler and planning to participate in the opening of the trout season tomorrow, it was now up to you.

The board reported a pre-season stocking of more than 70,000 adult trout and stream conditions the best in years. In addition, it was pointed out that the comparatively mild winter and few spring floods should be responsible for a good carryover of trout from last year.

The total stocking of adult brook, brown and rainbow trout for the season starting tomorrow, will reach approximately 150,000, hatchery inventories by the board indicate. Well over 70,000 are being held for planting at intervals between now and July 15 when the trout fishing season comes to a close on most streams.

Angling licenses are required for trout fishing, but women are exempt except for angling in stateleased and regulated waters. Youths under 16 must also obtain permits to tash in these waters.
