## DALADIER DEVALUES FRANC TO GET MORE FUNDS FOR DEFENSES

### France Seeking Solid Basis For Rearing Program, Fixes New Bottom For Franc; No Rise In Prices.

Paris, May 5.—(AP)—The Daladier government, seeking a solid monetary base for a rearing program, today fixed a new bottom for the franc at the level of 270 cents, or 35.80 francs to the dollar.

This stabilization represented a devaluation of about nine per cent from the average rates of the "floating franc" of the last ten months and brought the currency to the lowest level since the Poincaré stabilization of June 24, 1928.

The franc was ordered tied definitely to the pound sterling under the accord for monetary equilibrium among the United States, Britain and France.

The government acted simultaneously to prevent profiteering and price rises under the devaluation. The ministry of interior issued a communique saying:

"The government has decided to proceed to stabilization of the franc but this measure should in no way provoke any increase whatsoever in prices.

No Boost in Prices

"On the contrary, it should assure their proper stability."

Profiteers were ordered to take a census of today's prices for use by police surveillance committees. Unjustified increases will subject merchants to prosecution.

Finance Minister and Marchandieu, announcing the new monetary measure, emphasized that it was not "legal stabilization" because the gold content was not fixed by law. He called it "an operation whose goal is to achieve, first, de facto stabilization."

"What the government has decided in perfect conformity with the law is to set the franc at the rate of 270 francs for one pound sterling (\$3.50 to the dollar) will not be surpassed," Marchandieu said.

Can Only Improve

"The franc now can only improve and it will recover because the government will pursue that policy with a firm will. Massive repletions of capital showed as early as this morning that the significance of the government's decision is understood."

"French money supported by the effort of the entire country and protected against the undertakings of speculation will furnish a solid basis for the work of recovery."

Finance ministry officials, referring to Marchandieu's "massive repletions of capital," declared 4.

## ITALY PUTS ON WAR SHOW FOR HITLER'S VISIT

### Il Duce And Der Fuehrer Review 200 Fighting Ships In Big Demonstration Off The Coast Of Naples.

Naples, May 5.—(AP)—Thundering guns and churning propellers broke the calm of the Naples coast today as Hitler's navy went into its magnificent demonstration of its progress in honor of Reichsfuehrer and Italy.

A bright sun shone on the famous Neapolitan straits. Smoking Vesuvius in the background framed the blue sea, crowded with 200 fighting ships over which hovered squadrons of seaplanes.

In the center of the fleet that moved out of the gulf, each warship escorted by smaller craft, was the 22,000-ton battleship Cavour, carrying King Victor Emmanuel and his staff.

Suddenly, submarines broke the surface on all sides of the fleet in a mock attack and the warships thundered back.

In another maneuver, attack torpedo boats shrouded themselves in smoke and fired back to cover to escape counter-attacks.

Radio Controlled Ship

In the maneuvers was the navy vessel San Marco, a radio-controlled ship which has no crew. Her movements were directed from a nearby torpedo boat.

The naval panorama was the first of four great spectacles intended to show Hitler Italy's capacity for war during the week he is spending in the country.

The other three spectacles planned in honor of Italy's Nazi visitor were a grand military parade later in the week in Rome, a sham battle at Santa Marinella showing troops in escape counter-attacks.

## MOTHER ACCUSES SON OF UNSOLVED MURDERS

### Policeman Posing As A Clergyman Gets Confession Of 10-Year-Old Murder Details Of Crime.

Walla Walla, Wash., May 5.—(AP)—A 73-year-old mother accused her son of four unsolved mysterious murders, prison officials said today as they arranged to bring the pair together for the first time in ten years.

By a cue, Deputy Prosecutor John Schermer of King county said, investigations extracted from Mrs. Mary Eleanor Smith a gruesome tale of how her son, Earl De Carlo Mayer, was killed by a woman, James Eugene Bassett in Seattle ten years ago, dismembered his body and hid it in scattered, secluded spots.

Unexpectedly, Schermer said, Mrs. Smith wrote State Patrolman Joe McCauley, who duped her by posing as a clergyman, that Mayer had formed the east side of a salient in Montana and Idaho.

The letters named the victims as Mrs. Ernest La. Case of Butte, Mont., who vanished in 1923; Ole Larson, an Alameda, Mont., who disappeared in 1921, and a man named Randall whose body was buried in a stone quarry in Idaho.

## MAY NAME BOARD TO PROBE TRUSTS

### Leaders In Congress Propose Creation Of A Commission To Make Inquiry.

Washington, May 5.—(AP)—Congressional leaders proposed creation today of a National Economic Commission to investigate monopolistic practices in business, in accordance with President Roosevelt's recommendations.

The commission, an informal panel said, would consist of two Senators, two Representatives, the attorney general, the chairman of the Federal Trade Commission and the chairman of the securities commission.

Details of the investigation would be handled by the Justice Department, the FTC and the SEC.

The President, in his April 29 message recommended that \$500,000 be made available to these agencies for "a thorough study of the concentration of economic power."

The government must act, he said, to preserve and make workable our traditional system of free private enterprise.

Ask Quick Action

Some Congressional leaders said they doubted that it would be necessary to fund the full amount, since much information already is available. The highest wages would be the work of four existing departments.

## DEMOCRATIC ROW PLEASES ENEMIES

### Pennsy's G. O. P. Leaders See Great Change Of Getting The State Back Again

Harrisburg, Pa., May 5.—(AP)—Republicans, from whom the Democrats snatched Pennsylvania in 1934, saw the state's Democratic row today as "greatly improving" the chances of getting it back.

Escott G. Edward Green, state Republican chairman, said:

"Our chances are very good before. We are in much better shape now. Let the Democrats fight it out. This is their mess."

Superior Court Judge Arthur H. James and former governor Gifford Pinchot, rivals for the Republican gubernatorial nomination in Pennsylvania's May 17 primary, agreed.

The 73-year-old Pinchot, the governor, termed himself one with much experience in politics to make any predictions, but added:

"The Republican chances are greatly improved."

Crackling campaign charges of "ought" legislation and state emergency have led to a Grand Jury inquiry at Harrisburg and to separate investigations by the WPA and the State Department of Justice.

Mentioned in Charges

Mentioned in the charges were Governor George H. Earle and U. S. Senator Joseph F. Guffey. They led the 1934 campaign that made Earle Pennsylvania's first Democratic governor in 44 years.

They were mentioned in charges made by Senator Joseph P. Kamp and Boies Penrose, whose iron rule led this room for Democrats.

Now Guffey and Earle are split.

Guffey is backing Lieutenant Governor.

## CHINESE CLAIM NEW VICTORY IN CENTRAL CHINA

### Walled Town Of Matowchen, Key To Tancheng Is Captured — Japanese Lose On Another Battlefield.

Shanghai, May 5.—(AP)—An inspired Chinese army claimed capture of Matowchen, walled town of 200 population northwest of Tancheng, as continued "rapid progress" reported today in erasing the second Japanese offensive in southern Shantung province.

Matowchen was considered by Chinese commanders the key to Tancheng, which had become the southernmost point of the Japanese advance toward the Luanhai railway, 18 miles away.

Tancheng was encircled and beleaguered, Chinese said, though it had formed the east side of a salient until counter-offensives from the opposite corner at Tanchowang apparently straightened out the battle line.

At the same time a sudden attack by General Minno Chen-Lie's 57th Army was reported to have driven the Japanese back toward Antung along the Shantung-Kiangsu border. The attack relieved the threat of a Japanese thrust from the north at Halchow, seaport terminus of the Luanhai railway.

Pressure increased

Pressure was being increased on Tancheng by a reinvigorated army.
