CHURCHILL IN **NEW PLEA FOR**

Suggests Scheme Of Keep-Armed Peace Based On League Covenant: Would Protect Smaller Nations.

London, May 10 .- (AP) - Britain's Rebellious tory, Winston Churchill, stepped forward today as the nation's new champion of inter-national idealism and offered a plan for armed peace based upon League of Nations principles.

The fighting wartime chief of British sea forces, in a speech at Manchester last night, touched off a country-wide campaign to whip to

Manchester last night, touched off a country-wide campaign to whip together a non-party movement dedicated to formation of a ten-power entente with the League Covenant as its guiding star.

The Manchester gathering was the first of a series under the guidance of the powerful League of Nations Union calling on the world—in Churchill's . words—to "arm and stand by the covenant."






