BRAZIL DICTATOR RUSHES TRIALS TO PUNISH FASCISTS

Over 500 In Jail, 12 Were Killed In Attempted Revolt; Details Of The Plot Learned By The Police.

Rio De Janeiro, Brazil, May 12.—(AP)—Brazil's strong man President Getulio Vargas, invoked full military and police action today to wipe out former Fascist Party members, whose three and one-half hour rebellion failed because they did not know the government palace was without a garrison within its walls.

Police, with 500 of the rebels already in jail, spread through the city, searched every suspected Fascist's home, made more arrests and found evidence the revolt was well planned but without coordinated execution. The rebels made their attack yesterday morning against President Vargas' palace, the residence of the chief of staff of the army, and other strategic points—but they lacked the one vital piece of information that could have carried them to at least momentary success.

J. Alberto Lima De Barros, former charge d'affaires who helped defend the President's palace, told about it today. "I believe the attackers did not know the palace was completely without an internal garrison, otherwise they would have advanced into the palace instead of fighting in the gardens," he said.

"The truth is the President's life was in imminent danger." Vargas, with his dark-eyed 23-year-old daughter, Donna Alzira, and only five others were inside ready to fight off the attackers from palace windows, but fighting outside apparently convinced the rebels they faced a strong body of defenders. Arriving reinforcements saved the palace and the attackers captured no lives.

Vargas, his position as dictator apparently strengthened, immediately ordered martial law to carry on punitive action against the revolt which ended (Continued on Page Two)

AMOY IS TAKEN OVER BY JAPAN; U. S. FORCES ACT

Shanghai, May 12.—(AP)—American bluejackets today patrolled the International Settlement on Kulangsu Island, off the South China coast, as thousands of refugees and soldiers poured in from the Japanese naval forces captured nearby Amoy. The Japanese reported complete occupation of Amoy Island, including the city of Amoy, important port 600 miles south of Shanghai. All foreigners were said to be safe.

On the left wing of the 65-mile route, the Japanese asserted they reported new gains on the Lungtung and said the Chinese were in full flight. This is the nearest they have approached the vital east-coast railroad in five-months drive. Two Chinese divisions fighting at Matowchen, five miles northwest of Amoy, were said to have been "almost annihilated," and the message came from the Japanese.

Scenes on Kulangsu Island as Chinese civilians and soldiers sought refuge there were described as similar to those in Shanghai's International Settlement last August. Numerous refugees. While the island, ordinarily populated by 200 foreigners and 60,000 Chinese, was reported quiet, the great influx of refugees presented a new and increasing problem. It was reported that the Japanese were said to be occupying Italian consular property that the United States bluejackets landed on the island to guard the American property. The United States destroyer Esd, said Shanghai this afternoon might go to Foochow where American ships might need assistance in the event of developments such as those at Amoy.

The cruiser Marblehead, according to United States authorities here, was understood to be standing by at sea between Manila and Hongkong, awaiting developments. Japanese said small bands of Chinese were remaining on a hill near the city of Amoy and in isolated spots in other parts of the island, which is ten miles long and three miles wide. Their only means of escape was by boat, which would make open targets for Japanese planes.

Japanese Reports. The Japanese expressed confidence that continuous bombardment of Chinese military base in central China had brought Chinese resistance to the breaking point. They reported they had inflicted "serious damage" on Suichow, Junction of the Lungtung and Tientsin-Peking railroads, in new raids. Yesterday wounded 300 there and had damaged 4,000 houses.
