

A brakeman riding between two freight cars suddenly slipped, falling to the tracks and severely crushing one leg. He was given first aid at the scene of the accident and rushed ten miles to the nearest hospital. The man died on the way to the hospital from loss of blood.

"In a second case, a young marto we realize what would happen
