Declares Totalitarian States JAPAN CLAIMS Will Act Together If al War By Democracies.

Genos, Italy, May 14-(AP)- Vital Lunghai Railway Has Premier Benito Mussolini. hitting back at what Italy regards as anti-Fascist bias in the United States, declared today that the Totalitarian states would "become a bloc and march together to the end" if threatened with a "doctrinal war by the so-called Democracies."

If Duce's thinly-welled but unmistakeable thrusts at "speeches from across the ocean" reflected the Ital-
