**THOUSANDS VIEW FIRST "BLACKOUT"**

**Air Raids Over Long Island Village Most Spectacular; War Games End Today.**

Farmingdale, N. Y., May 17.—(AP)—The "blackout" a civilian defense against the terror of the air raids that are a nightmare to thousands here last night in the United States for the first time, and it has all the drawing power of a three-ring circus.

As a spectacular finale to four days of simulated air raids, the general headquarters of the United States Civil Defense Administration today ended the "war" by ending a series of simulated air raids on the Long Island village of Farmingdale, L. I., an hour from New York.

The climax phase of the war games involved missions along the coast of Long Island Sound, from which various towns were attacked by simulated bombers. The "war" was ended except for the grand finale which was a simulated air raid on Farmingdale, L. I., an hour from New York.

Heads "Presidential" Stamp Series

LONG awaited in philatelic circles, the new U. S. "Presidential" series of postage makes the box with the stamp. Leon George Washington stamp produced already more than one and one-half times actual size.

Printed in green ink, in sheets of 100 by rotary process, the stamp is 0.75 by 0.75 inches, with a flat background and without border. It is designed by Miss Elaine Rawlinson of New York City, winner of a nationwide contest conducted several months ago by the Treasury Department. Very popular throughout the entire issue of 32 stamps in this new series.

First stamp of the series numerically will be the Franklin D. Roosevelt. The Washington will appear on the 14 cent, and the White House will be shown on a 4-cent adhesive. With these exceptions the series, to take the place of the regular values, will portray all deceased Presidents, many of whom never before were honored on U. S. postage. The Washington stamp is the first.
