CRASHED AIRPLANE FOUND; 'ALL DEAD' RANCHER REPORTS

Los Angeles Receives Report Air Liner With Nine Aboard Crashed In Mountains; On Way To Scene.

Los Angeles, May 18.—(AP)—The sheriff's office received a report from a Mint Canyon rancher today that he had sighted the charred wreckage of the missing Lockheed air liner and all nine persons aboard were dead.

The discovery was made by Walter Peterson, 20 miles north of Santa Anita, in a rugged area where a two-day search, hampered by fog, had been in progress.

Officials estimated it would take several hours to reach the wreckage and they expected difficulty in bringing the bodies out of the rough Sierra Pelona region which Peterson described as the scene of the tragic end of a short-cut taken by the liner that had yet to be delivered into transport service.

Air search yesterday was halted by a fog that still cloaked the mountain peaks of the region this morning as Peterson came in with his report.

CIO CANDIDATES LOSE IN PENN. PRIMARIES; JONES AND EARLE WIN

Lewis Remains Silent As He Hears Results

Washington, May 18.—(AP)—Designated Democratic nominee for Governor, Lewis, however, believed the victorious state organization would not now consider such a peace proposal.

Democratic workers were hopeful that in any event the C. I. O. forces would support their party in the gray state headquarters of the United Mine Workers and studied his primary returns.

Philadelphia, May 18.—(AP)—Candidates endorsed by CIO Chief John L. Lewis and Senator Joseph P. Guffey were routed in Pennsylvania primary balloting that gave a sweeping triumph to the Democratic state committee and brought Republican predictions today of victory in November.

The primary-ave blessing of Democratic National Chairman James A. Farley did not save Thomas Kennedy, Lewis-Guffey gubernatorial candidate, from trailing Charles Alvin Jones of Pittsburgh, state committee choice, by more than 35,000 votes with less than 1,000 of the state's 8,975 precincts unreported.

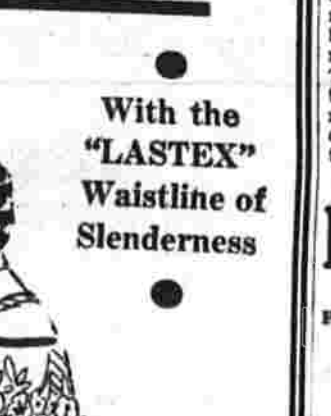

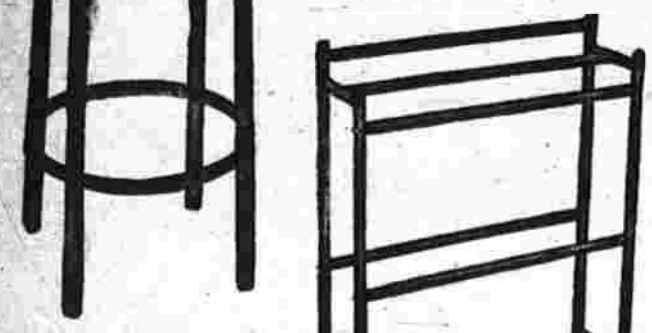
