BRITAIN'S AIM IS PEACE PACT WITH GERMANY

Foreign Secretary Halifax Tells House of Lords That Empire Seeks Friendship With People Of The Reich

London, May 18.—(AP)—The British government clearly and specifically has made an appointment with Germany a primary objective of its foreign policy.

There had been indications of drive for German friendship during negotiations for the accord with Italy which was signed April 16, but it remained for Foreign Secretary Viscount Halifax to voice the definite aim.

Summarizing Premier Chamberlain's program of facing facts in a troubled world, Viscount Halifax yesterday told the House of Lords: "We believe that by our Italian agreement we have made a beginning, and we are resolved to seek every possibility of continuing and developing that action."

Slightly as we value our existing friendships and intimacies as we happily are with France, we do not regard them as by any means exclusive, and while strengthening them we seek always to increase their number and extend their scope.

He avoided, for example, like to see removed all causes of mistrust and suspicion that may be held to stand in the way of complete understanding between ourselves and Germany.

Shared by People "That desire abroad, I believe, is to see Germany and Britain as partners in a common life."

Cheers greeted the reference to German friendship, but Viscount Halifax did not further elaborate. An opposition motion to censure the Chamberlain foreign policy was defeated without a record vote.

The foreign secretary said in the British efforts a step toward peace, accepting in good faith Italian assurances of friendship which cooled under British advocacy of sanctions during Italy's campaign in Ethiopia.

ITALO-FRENCH PARLEY NEARS A BREAKDOWN

Premier Daladier In Surprise Statement Places Blame On Duce—Says France Will Defend Her Frontier.

Paris, May 18.—(AP)—Premier Edouard Daladier declared that France would defend her frontiers against "all attempts at violence" in a surprise statement delivered today as France's negotiations with Italy for a friendship agreement approached a complete breakdown.

To newspapermen whom he summoned to his office, the head of the "National Defense" Cabinet, declared: "France will persist in proving her close union, her calm self-possession, the can-do it because she is strong."

"Her will for peace is her first guarantee; her strength is her supreme guarantee."

Indirectly the premier threw the blame for the impasse in the friendship talks on Italy, asserting that France was "occupied by divergent everywhere and with everybody for her own ends."

The premier's declaration came as Italian efforts to break up France's alliance with Soviet Russia had imposed formidable obstacles to efforts for Franco-Italian accord.

Conversations for such an agreement began in Rome before Adolf Hitler's visit to Italy May 3, were suspended during that visit, and have not been resumed.

Daladier's warning: "Whatever the circumstances France is capable of assuring alone the independence and integrity of her territory against all attempts at violence."

Foreign informants said that despite French efforts to resume the Rome talks Italy is demanding concessions France is not likely to make.

STATE OFFICIALS ASKED TO CUT EXPENDITURES

Governor Cross Sends Letter To Heads Of All Budgeted Agencies Asking Cooperation To Avert Crisis.

Hartford, May 18.—(AP)—Governor Cross today sent the following letter to the heads of all budgeted agencies: "The administration is confronted with the problem of restricting expenditures during the next fiscal year to the extent that may be necessary to balance receipts and expenditures of the general fund."

"I am respectfully certain that for the current fiscal year the budget can be balanced in spite of the business recession which has come upon us."

"It appears that this may be accomplished without any drastic curtailment of state services since the departments and institutions have cooperated with the supervisor of purchases, the personnel director, and the budget director in effecting substantial savings."

"The President gave assurance he would take care of the employees' situation through the means of the state treasury."

"Incidentally that is a terrible thing—arbitrary drawing of salaries as well as the unemployment of those who are dependent on the state for their livelihood."

"I need them," he said, "I haven't been able to buy a pair since Roosevelt was elected."

CORONER TO PROBE AIRPLANE CRASH

Official Cannot Understand Why Machine Was Flying So Low In Foggy Weather

Los Angeles, May 18.—(AP)—The tragic question of why a new \$30,000 transport plane killed nine persons in a crash on a fog-shrouded canyon ridge while commercial air lines flew safely at higher altitudes, was asked today by Coroner Frank A. Nance on the eve of a public inquest.

"I have talked to witnesses who said they saw the plane flying not more than 500 feet from the ground," Nance said.

The inquest tomorrow at 9:30 a. m. (p. m.) in San Fernando morning will be the only public inquest held by the Bureau of Air Commerce officials are privately preparing a report for Washington headquarters.

The wrecked plane, a 14-passenger two-motor Lockheed which had been redesigned since it was first built last July, carried three men, four women and two children to flaming death only 30 air miles from its takeoff at Union Air Terminal, Burbank, Monday afternoon.

WILD RUMORS AFLOAT AS WATERBURY JURY GETS READY TO REPORT

Judge Wynne Denies Kemp Plea to Quash Parkway Indictments

Bridgeport, May 18.—(AP)—The Grand Jury procedure followed in the Merritt Parkway investigation was upheld by Superior Court Judge Kenneth Wynne today when he denied a motion by George Kemp to quash indictments returned against him by the jury.

Following the denial of Kemp's motion, State Attorney Louis W. Willis announced that he would move for trial of the former station purchasing agent on the several conspiracy indictments against him at the June term of the Criminal Superior Court.

Willis also announced that the last of the eight persons indicted by the Grand Jury in the investigation of fraud in the purchases of the Merritt Parkway right of way will surrender himself within the next three or four days.

Kemp's final request in his argument that Judge Wynne permit the question of the Grand Jury procedure to be sent to the Superior Court is being considered by the judge.

Ground Work for Appeal All these claims were set up, by Kemp's counsel in a move which, it was admitted, was the groundwork for an appeal to the United States Supreme Court in the event that Judge Wynne should sustain the indictments.

Fliers Say City On Fire In Many Sections; Hand-To-Hand Fighting In Streets.

Shanghai, May 18.—(AP)—Large sections of Suchow were reported burning fiercely today as Japanese, claiming possession of most of the city, fought hand-to-hand with Chinese in the southern suburbs.

They said naval planes bombing the low altitude planes scored a direct hit on what apparently was the main munitions storehouse, sending flames and smoke hundreds of feet into the air.

Another tremendous fire, also apparently from a powder magazine, was reported in the southeastern section of the city.

All the city except the southern part, where fighting continued, was said by the Japanese to have been in their hands.

OREGON PRIMARY TO BE NEXT TEST
