

JOHN GOLDEN QUITS AS RESULT OF PROBE BY WATERBURY JURY

New Haven Official Tenders His Resignation And It Is Accepted; Other Repercussion Of The Inquiry.

New Haven, May 28.—(AP)—The recent reports by Grand Jurors in Waterbury and Bridgeport which criticized Connecticut political leaders had caused additional repercussions today in the state.

Bombs fell on Canton and Barcelona today in the world's two major conflicts; Mexico's eighth-day revolt appeared to be on the last legs, and uneasy Czecho-Slovakia marked fear of Germany with a flag-waving celebration of President Eduard Benes' 64th birthday.

YOUTHS RECRUITED TO FIGHT IN SPAIN

Bay State's Legislators Hear Charges Of Red Influence Spreading In The U. S.

Boston, May 28.—(AP)—Charges that Communists recruited Massachusetts youth to fight for Spanish government forces, even to the extent of offering to pay transportation under assumed names, today were placed before the Legislature.

Climaxing a nine-month investigation of Communist, Fascist, Nazi and Ku Klux Klan activities in the state, a special commission warned that Communist influence was "spreading rapidly."

Legislation was also urged providing punishment for any person attempting to incite "race hatred" and regulating foreign fraternal benefit societies, requiring them to make public records of their membership and officers.

Assailing what it called attempts of Communists to liken themselves to the "so-called American revolutionaries," the commission said: "The Communist aim is to create revolution in the American Colonies made no attempt to create revolution in the homeland; but for asking all that seeking to turn themselves into an opportunity to live lives free of the pressure of Imperialism."

Moved by the boy's troubled story of how he shot Charlotte Matthews, 18, "at her request" because she was pregnant and feared disgrace, a jury of middle-aged married men last night returned a verdict of "not guilty because of insanity."

The parents met with laughter and in the office of Defense Attorney Raymond Rosenthal, "my prayers are answered," said Matthews. "I want him to go to some of my house again."

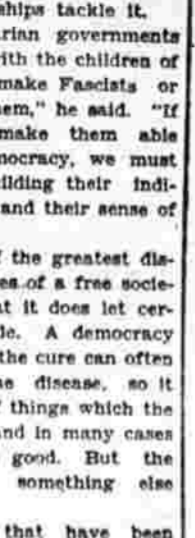

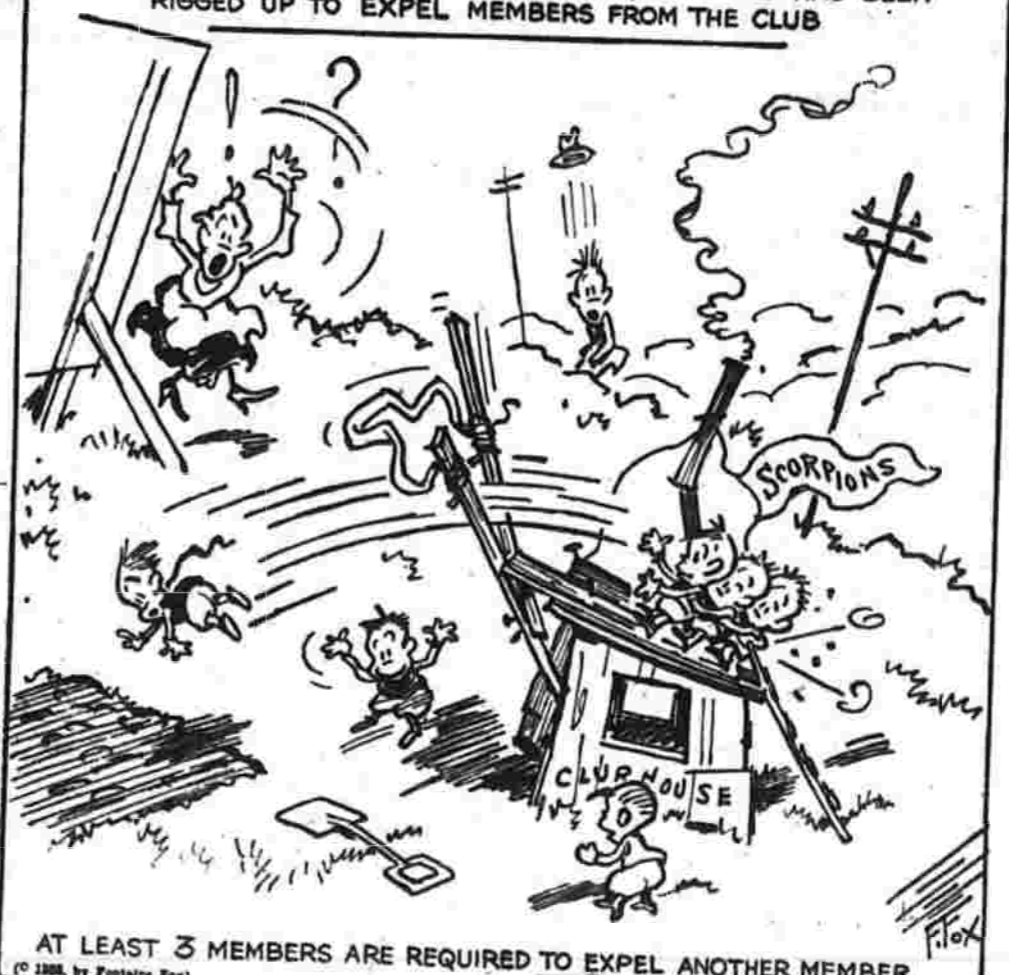


