On the other hand there is much evidence that Congress' idea of spending public money for relief of unemployment are almost as fantastic as the President's and may possibly be even less effective. Senate conservatives declare that they have numbers of projects which could be started at once—and they particularly mention food-control, rivers and harbors and army housing projects.

On the whole Mr. Allen's somewhat brusque and somewhat frank demand that the Governor purge himself of his associations by promising to have nothing done in the country about it, seems to us to be very much to the point and very much in the interest of better government for the state of Connecticut. What he said needed saying.

Two Years Too Soon... Abandonment of the impracticable purpose of obtaining passage of an act for the reorganization of federal government agencies at this session is accompanied by a declaration of administration intention to use passage of such a measure immediately after the convening of the new Congress next year.

Defeatism... Former Senator and present Connecticut Welfare Commissioner Frederic C. Watson has no doubts that he has been demoralized so far that he is not likely to be of much use in the reorganization of the federal government.

Choice of Evils... The dilemma in which the country finds itself through the Roosevelt-Congressional conflict over control of the proposed great relief fund is debaterising. Some three and a third billions are involved and the President and Congress are quarreling over whether the former shall have a free hand in spending the money or whether Congress should earmark large appropriations to specific purposes.
