HALF CANTON'S POPULATION IS **GONE IN FLIGHT**

Two More Bombings Life Deaths To 3,000; American University, Oil Tanks Hit By Sky Assallants.

Canton, China, June 8 .- (AP)-Two new bombardments today raised civilian casualties in this crippled city, to at least 3,000 killed id 5,000 wounded in 12 successive and 5,000 wounded in 12 successive days of Japanese air raids. Two American-owned properties, the Lingham University and oil tanks of the Standard Oil Company were struck by Japanese bombs today.
