

CHINA NEARER VICTORY AVERS NATION'S HEAD

Chiang Confident As Japanese Follow His Armies Into The Heart of Country—Cut Railroad Lines.

Shanghai, June 10.—(AP)—Japanese cut the Peiping-Hankow railroad for the first time south of the Yellow river today and launched an attack on Chengchow against feeble resistance as their drive inland through the heart of China gained momentum.

Most of the Chinese forces were said to have withdrawn to the south, first to defend themselves in the path of Japan's westward offensive and, secondly, to make their stand in more mountainous country where Japan's highly mechanized forces would have less advantage.

Chiang Kai-shek, who has been reported to have moved his headquarters from Chengchow to a Catholic mission at Hsuehshieh because of incessant Japanese air attacks. With Dr. Auye were two British colleagues.

Chinese bombing planes sank a Japanese warship at Kweichow, on the Yangtze river, with a direct hit, a Chinese communication reported.

It said an air squadron attacked the Japanese ship in the Yangtze within 30 miles of Anking, capital of Anhwei province and the most objective in Japan's push up the river toward Hankow.

FRANCE READY FOR EXTREMES TO STOP RAIDS

Tells Britain She Will Act With London To End The Insurgent Attacks On Ships; Reprisals Unlikely.

London, June 10.—(AP)—Britain, fully backed by France and the French foreign minister, reported today to the British ambassador in Paris that France was willing to cooperate with London in "extreme measures" to end the Mediterranean scourge of lead and steel which has sunk or damaged at least 15 neutral ships in two weeks.
