Any gas range or other gas burning appliance sold in Connecticut, which carries the blue seal of approval of the American Gas Association Laboratory signifying maximum efficiency and safety, must be capable of equally good performance if it is transferred to some other state where a different type other state where a different type of gas, manufactured and natural, from that served in this State is used. To this end, ranges, automa-tic water heaters, room heaters, refrigerators and other gas appliances are tested in the laboratory at Cleveland with several different gases representative of those served throughout the country. To make certain that the gases used in the testing are correct for all types and conditions, the laboratory has just completed a thore survey of the country. When the laboratory was established in 192

the problem of selecting test ga was satisfied only after gases fr all parts of the country were du various appliances. Great change in the gas supplies have taken place since 1925 particularly in the ex-pansion of natural gas service and the mixing of natural and manuictured gases, so a second surve of field conditions of gas service was made in 1932 to 1934.
