TROOPS FLEEING BEFORE ONRUSH OF CHINA FLOOD

Both Chinese and Japanese In Path Of Water Spilling Through Great Breaks In The Yellow River Dikes.

Shanghai, June 15.—(AP)—Both Chinese and Japanese armies were fleeing today before a Yellow river flood that could not be stopped either by guns or bombs.

WAGE, HOUR ACT MAY GET TESTS IN HIGH COURT

Only President's Signature Needed To Start Regulation Of Labor Conditions; Court Action Is Expected.

Washington, June 15.—(AP)—Only President Roosevelt's signature was needed today to start an unprecedented Federal program for nation-wide regulation of industrial working hours and minimum pay.

The act is calculated to fix the minimum pay and maximum hours of 700,000 industrial workers, as well as the hours of another 1,500,000 unskilled workers.

The President may appoint immediately an administrator who will have broad powers to interpret the act and to instruct committees of employers, workers and private citizens to be set up for each interstate industry.

Rep. Ramspeck (D., Ga.) who helped draft the bill said a large additional force of Federal troops were turning out to life-saving, participating feverishly in building levees.

### Women Gain New Honors In Seventy-fifth Congress

Washington, June 15.—(AP)—A small band of women won new legislative laurels for their sex in the Seventy-fifth Congress which closed tonight.

Rep. Mary T. Norton (D-N.J.) was the first woman to be elected to the House of Representatives in the Seventy-fifth Congress.

Mrs. Hattie Caraway (D-Ark.) was elected to the Senate by the voters of her state.

Mrs. Norton's supervision of the dramatic fighting for the wage-hour bill began when she fell from the labor committee chairmanship last June. She studied day and night, and her committee approved a measure in August.

In the special session last December, she led the floor fight for the bill, sending out for milk at lunch time. A coalition of Republicans and southern Democrats shied the legislation.

The rough-and-tumble battle resumed in January. By mid-April Mrs. Norton got her committee agreed on a revised measure, only to be stymied by refusal of the rules committee to let it come up for discussion. Finally she forced the bill through the House by using a petition, just as she had done in the special session.

She was ill with grippe when the bill came up again, but she stayed at her post, and the measure was approved. An infection set in and she went to bed, but got up quickly to see the bill passed in the Senate committee which finally reached a compromise on the legislation last night to the White House.

### CITES MASSACHUSETTS AUTO INSURANCE LAW

If Planning To Spend Over 30 Days In Bay State In Year Drivers Must Comply.

Connecticut motorists who plan to be in Massachusetts more than thirty days during the coming year must secure a permit from the Registrar of Motor Vehicles to conform with the requirements of the Massachusetts Compulsory Insurance Law according to Commissioner Michael A. Connor of the Department of Motor Vehicles.

The thirty days do not necessarily have to run consecutively. Commissioner Connor said. "If several trips make up a total of more than thirty days, the permit is required."

Motorists who plan additional visits into Massachusetts must get a "re-entry permit." According to a recent ruling made by Registrar Goodwin of Massachusetts, such visitors must apply at a branch office of the registry. In person, and secure the necessary permit for which no fee is charged.

The permit will be issued if a public liability insurance policy in the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) covering death or injury to any one person, and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) covering death or injury to two or more persons, is presented with the application.

While Commissioner Connor reiterates his plan for safer driving, in his statement he recognizes the fact that traffic accidents are caused and points out that the department in Massachusetts in violation of the law would not be entitled to their day in court in the event of civil action as the result of an accident.

### WOODWORK CLASSES TO BEGIN ON MONDAY

Annual Course Sponsored by Recreation Center To Continue For Eight Weeks.

### General Slocum Disaster Occurred 34 Years Ago

New York, June 15.—(AP)—A solemn little band of survivors today recalled a June morning 34 years ago when historic "Hell Gate" on New York's East river became a really a blazing inferno filled with the screams of the dying.

### TEST OF RANGES DONE WITH MANY TYPES OF GASES

Any gas range or other gas burning appliance sold in Connecticut, which carries the blue seal of approval of the American Gas Association laboratory signifying maximum efficiency and safety, must be capable of equally good performance if it is transferred to some other state where a different type of gas is manufactured and natural gas, from that which is in the state. To this end, range, automatic water heaters, room heaters, refrigerators and other gas appliances are tested in the laboratory at Cleveland with several different gases representative of those served throughout the country.

To make certain that the gas used in the testing are correct for all types and conditions, the laboratory has just completed a thorough survey of the country. When the laboratory was established in 1925, the problem of selecting test gases was studied only after gases from all parts of the country were duplicated in Cleveland and burned in various appliances. Great changes in the gas supplies have taken place since 1925 particularly in the case of natural gas, and the mixing of natural and manufactured gases is now a common thing. It was necessary to make a field conditions of gas service was made in 1932 to 1934.

The third survey was made this year. The study differed from the first two in that it included, in addition to previous methods, a series of tests in which the laboratory representatives, not only the appliance operation under a variety of gas conditions, but the actual testing of the gases in a number of large cities.
