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### Farm Crops of the South As Unemployment Remedy

Roanoke, Va., June 16.—(AP)—An attack on the dual problem of farm crops and unemployment in the South, urged today, the creation of new industries using farm crops for raw material as a means to remedy unemployment. He spoke before the Virginia Agricultural Experiment Station.

The chemical industry, making possible such new industries, he said, is needed south because the southland possesses that rare combination of youth, power and raw materials which is irreplaceable, providing the new tools which modern science affords are utilized.

"In Virginia and throughout the south, he continued, you have untouched wealth greater than that of India and a population of about 20 million compared to 350 million who reside in that mystic land. As a land leader as resources are concerned, you have scarcely begun to touch the soil."

The speaker said the problem of co-ordinating science with the productivity of the soil is a problem of the future. He said the south must have an annual value of \$1,500,000,000.
