INDIA CHOLERA SPREADING OVER A GREAT AREA

Reaches Into Afghanistan As Well As Central Provinces; Native Superstitions Hamper Sanitation.

Lucknow, India, June 17.—(AP)—India's cholera epidemic, already in its 15th season of Congress, is spreading over a vast area of northwestern India. The epidemic is said to have reached Afghanistan, beyond the northwestern frontier, and into India's central provinces.

Newly affected areas in northwestern India included parts of the Punjab states, northwest frontier province, and the Bihar region. India's western extremity is estimated to be 600,000 inoculated.

Anti-cholera inoculations have been administered free to 600,000 persons in the United Provinces where the battle against the seven-week-old scourge is being directed by Hon. Mrs. Vijayalakshmi Pandit, a member of the new Nationalist government.

Health workers dumped 115 tons of potassium permanganate in polluted wells to purify them. Authorities attempted to regulate disposition of the bodies of victims. According to an old Hindu tradition, persons who die of cholera, smallpox or smallpox must neither be buried nor burned.

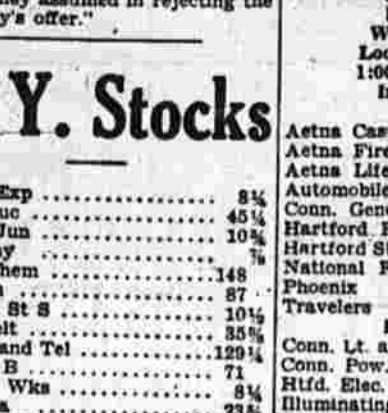

CUT NEW PATHWAYS IN CENTER PARK

Workmen are cutting new pathways through the Center park and closing up some of the old walks that circled through the park. The walk that connected with the two entrances to the park on Linden street, has been closed and a new walk will be laid from the Chestnut street entrance to cut across through the park in a curve that will connect with the Chestnut street side of the park just below Center street. Stakes that have been set in the park show that a change will be made in the walk from the entrance on the west side at Chestnut street to connect with the Pearl street entrance of the park. Instead of taking the sweeping curve, as is now the case, the walk will be laid in almost a straight line, which will make a shorter walk across the park and will also help in keeping people from walking on the grass between these two points, as has been the case.

TOWN MAY GET RETURN FROM STATE'S PROPERTY

Edgerton Place On North Main Street Lensed So Taxes May Now Be Collected. The town of Manchester may receive a small, but unexpected amount of money in the form of tax payment from the state school fund if negotiations now in progress are completed, it was revealed today. Some years ago the state secured title through foreclosure on what is known as the Edgerton property on North Main street, and at that time the premises became public lands and the town lost the right to collect taxes on them. Intermittently, since that date, as the state has rented or leased the property, the town has collected some revenue, as it is provided that when the state profits from rental of public lands, it shall pay local taxes.

For several years now, the Edgerton property has not been bringing revenue to the state, or to the town. This year the premises have been placed on lease, and the state has notified the town that it will consider deterioration and drop in value of several outbuildings.

The Board of Assessors has placed a value of \$12,000 on the place, which consists of some 21 acres of land, with a dwelling and several outbuildings. Recently the state sent its own appraisers to value the property, and they set the value at \$5,958. It is understood that the town and state appraisal for land and dwellings were approximately the same, but the state claimed deterioration and drop in value of several outbuildings.

The state has notified the town that it will pay taxes on its own assessment, rather than on the town's figure, and failing to secure the \$5,958 assessment total, will appeal the assessment. However, the local Board is to view the premises again, and a compromise may be effected.
