

GOVERNOR BEGINS ECONOMY PARLEYS

Cross And His Advisors Decide On How Far To Go To Save Funds.

Hartford, June 20.—(AP)—The state's new executive budget system will first meet today as Governor Cross today begins a series of economy parleys with his financial advisors. The governor and his advisors will discuss the budget and decide how far they will go in reducing personnel and other state services under the new economy program now in effect. For the first time since the system was created under the reorganization program last year the governor must decide how much money the state will get for the first quarter of the new fiscal year beginning July 1, by taking into consideration the entire year's needs for various agencies and what they would do to make the present year's budget work. The state must not exceed their appropriations and their deficit would not occur.

The 125 executive units in the executive department of the state government have either already filed their requests with a 10 per cent reduction in their budgets as requested by the governor, or they have registered protests that they would not meet the requirements.

Private funds. The five corporate institutions and most of the welfare institutions have also filed their requests with budgets 10 per cent out of the state's budget.

Governor Cross must decide how far these reductions are to go and whether or not to accept requests for more money. The governor has a right to refuse requests for more money that might be drawn for certain items.

Each case will be taken up at the conference which began at 10:30 today. Budget Director Benjamin F. Whitaker and his budget assistants are assisting the governor in facing the various state requests that the governor may make up his mind whether to permit.

Budget Director Whitaker says that the meetings are being held today and may carry over into next week.

Protests that they cannot meet the 10 per cent cut have been made by the State Police, the Meriden Chamber of Commerce, the Meriden Electric Light Co., and the Meriden, Niantic, and Long Lane Electric Co. in Hartford.
