ENRAGED BY MORE SHIP RAIDS, M. P.'S HECKLE PREMIER

Two British Ships Bombed With Several Casualties; Chamberlain Objects To Arming Of Merchantmen.

London, June 27.—(AP)—Prime Minister Chamberlain's opponents in the House of Commons, enraged by two more attacks on British ships in Spanish ports, sought vainly today to have him arm British merchantmen with anti-aircraft guns. Chamberlain tried to stem a flood of hostile questions with a declaration that "a good many difficulties" stand in the way of such a move.

Replying to Laborite Philip J. Noel-Baker, Chamberlain first said that further consideration of the suggestion has revealed additional difficulties.

Asked if the government would suggest to the Spanish Non-Intervention Committee that merchantmen be supplied with machine-guns to defend themselves against low-flying attackers, Chamberlain explained that had been considered in the past.

Technical Objection

"I am informed that fitting of merchant vessels with anti-aircraft equipment would require structural alterations," Chamberlain said.

Bombing of two British freighters today by airmen in the service of the Spanish insurgents, added to a long list of such assaults, as newly listed Chamberlain's policy of meeting such incidents with only protests and negotiations.

From the Conservative side of the House, Sir Walter Smiles suggested that anti-aircraft guns require "only very light equipment."

Opposition leader Clement R. Attlee asked: "May we safely assume that the prime minister's answer that it is impossible to fit anti-aircraft guns to British merchant ships now or at any time, and so British merchant ships cannot be defended against aircraft in event of war?"

OUTLAW SLAIN

Joliet, Ill., June 27.—(AP)—Two outlaws who terrorized parts of Indiana and Illinois with gunfire and kidnapings reached dead end in a slaying here today. One slain and the other wounded.

Approximately 100 peace officers of the two states were on the kill which climaxed a 20 minute battle of sharp fighting.

Sheriff John Stack of Kane County, Ill., said the wounded man identified himself as Orville J. Easton, 35, of Valley City, N. D., and named his slain companion as his brother, Clarence Easton, 27.

NATIONAL GUARD CASE

Hartford, June 27.—(AP)—The trial of Charles R. Tubbs, East Lyme, on charges of defrauding the United States government in connection with delivering supplies to the National Guard camp at Naugatuck in 1934 opened here today in Federal District Court.

This is the last of several National Guard cases in which Tubbs was indicted on charges of conspiracy to defraud the government of \$218 by procuring false vouchers for payment by the government for supplies delivered by the Charles R. Tubbs and Company of Naugatuck.

THOMPSONVILLE STRIKE ENDS

Thompsonville, June 27.—(AP)—Approximately 2,000 persons returned to their pools in the Hilsbos Sanford Carpet Co. plant here today after having been out on strike for nearly seven weeks. The return was without incident.

Officials of the company and of the local carpet workers' union said that the remaining employees, numbering about 1,500, would all be working by Wednesday.

GERMANY RECALLS ENVOY TO CHINA

Dispute Over Departure Of Reich's Military Experts Brings The Berlin Order.

Hankow, June 25.—(Delayed)—(AP)—Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek's reluctance to allow the departure of his German military advisers has resulted in strong Berlin representations.

The latest German action was the recall of Ambassador Oskar Trautmann, who will leave Hankow by air tomorrow.

At a farewell meeting today between Chiang Kai-shek and Trautmann, the generalissimo finally agreed that the Germans might discontinue their advisory duties but he definitely reserved the right to say when and how they might leave Hankow and China.

On May 21 Berlin requested the Chinese government to release the German advisers from their contracts, but the generalissimo's absence from Hankow delayed action on the request.

does not realize that all the President's eggs are in the basket of economic advances. He and his cabinet, he and conventional political and economic thought, have nothing to do with each other, and can have nothing to do with each other. In either his own view or that of his most bitter opponent, he can get nowhere and accomplish nothing by any policy or measure of economic reform. He must go along the road of "liberalism" if he is to go at all. That being the case, why should he be expected to do anything with conservatism but to fight it, when he finds it in an openly antagonistic party or in his own? If Mr. Roosevelt can't make a "liberal" party out of the Democratic ranks, it is already sunk. And we must grant him this position even if he has his own peculiar ideas concerning what liberalism really is.
