BARTON TELLS GOP TO WIN FAITH NOW PUT IN ROOSEVELT

Says People Demand A Plan, Urges Broad Liberal Program, Declares Railroads Must Have Lower Rates.

Indianapolis, June 29.—(AP)—Rep. Bruce Barton (R., N. Y.), said today the "mass feeling" of faith—whether "well founded or ill-founded"—in President Roosevelt was "the controlling political influence of our day" and advised the Republican party to try to capture that faith for itself.

Barton's keynote speech prepared for the Indiana state Republican convention a nation projected a campaign program which would accept the New Deal reforms deemed "sound," but would put national administration back in the hands of a "Republican party cleansed, changed, re-dedicated to service."

He told the convention that to ignore the President's popular appeal was "business as usual" and that it is political insanity.

People Demand Plan

"Give us a plan," the people cry, "show us a picture," he went on. "Here, in broad daylight, the Republican picture: We see a land in which no more great fortunes are likely to be amassed; a land where those who now have great fortunes will be compelled to put those fortunes into production for the public good or to have them legally redistributed.

"But it is a land where the power to tax, which has been rightly termed 'the power to destroy,' is used not to destroy but to stimulate."

"We see a land where the farm problem and the railroad problem are treated not as separate problems but as integral parts of the greater whole. We see our separate problems; federal aid; we see facilities for the free storage of surplus crops; we see an end to the program of scarcity."

Tens of Thousands of Jobs

"But we see railroads rehabilitated and tens of thousands of unemployed workers back at work—not by the straggle process of piecemeal legislation, but by the process of very low rates. Prosperity, as every sensible man knows, consists of volume multiplied by velocity. To attempt recovery while at the same time you let the nation's transportation system go to smash is the height of madness."

"We will step up business by stepping up and cheapening transportation, and in so doing we will take a constructive step toward the solution of the farm problem, the housing problem and the problem of relief."

"We see the farmer and the worker enjoying the full enjoyment of the great home market, protected by a Republican tariff from the destructive competition of cheap labor and low standards abroad."

"We see a country wherein the relief problem has been studied scientifically; where the cause of a census not merely of needs, but of skills; where employment

ROOSEVELT TALKS ON RELIEF NEEDS
Informs Nation Big Federal Drive on Depression Will Be In Full Swing Soon.

Hyde Park, N. Y., June 29.—(AP)—President Roosevelt today told the nation that the big federal drive on depression will be in full swing soon.

At the same time, the President said, this country still is searching for a permanent solution of the unemployment problem—a solution that will not involve big expenditures for armaments.

Mr. Roosevelt, discussing relief objectives at a press conference late yesterday, said one matter under study was how Sweden was able to pay off the cost of a public works relief program, instituted during bad years, with funds accruing during more prosperous times.

The President compared that Scandinavian country's success with the United States which he noted did not rid itself in the comparatively good business years of 1926-27 of the cost of lending and spending programs in 1933-35.

STATE SEN. LAWLOR, NAMED IN BRIBERY CHARGE, IS STRICKEN

Reportedly Seriously Ill From Ruptured Appendix; Had Just Recently Recovered From Pneumonia Attack.

Waterbury, June 29.—(AP)—State Senator Joseph H. Lawlor, one of five men charged with accepting a bribe while a member of the 1935 General Assembly, was reported today in a critical condition as a result of a ruptured appendix.

Lawlor, dean and president, pro tempore of the Senate, underwent an emergency operation at St. Mary's hospital yesterday. Peritonitis set in.

His physician, Dr. M. J. Lawlor, described the legislator's condition as "very critical," and said the outcome of his patient's illness would be in doubt for two or three days.

Last week, Lawlor pleaded innocent in Superior Court at Hartford to the bribery charge, the outcome of a Special Grand Jury inquiry into Waterbury municipal affairs and legislative lobbying.

Lawlor, a member of the Senate since 1925, recently recovered from pneumonia.

The Senator, 58 years of age, returned from the State.

DEAD MAN'S AUTO SOLD BY SUSPECT

New York Police Disclose Evidence in Morris Case; Suspect Held Without Bail

Northampton, Mass., June 29.—(AP)—New York police said today that John Paul Bahbett, 26, of New York, held here without bail on a charge of murdering Charles Morris, race track trolley driver, had sold an automobile identified as once belonging to Morris.

A body believed that of Morris was found last week in the Connecticut river.

Detective Lieut. Martin O'Connor, announcing what he called a "very important link in the chain of evidence in the Bahbett case," said Bahbett sold to a New York dealer last Oct. 11 a sedan, believed to be Morris', which was later found in the body of Morris.

In nearby Springfield, Dr. Charles Krasnow, a dentist whose office is across the street from the hotel where Morris lived while attending Agawam race track, told newsmen he could identify the teeth found in the body as Morris'.

Dr. Krasnow said he had done so.

TWO BRITISH WARSHIPS ORDERED TO PROCEED TO MALLORCA ISLAND

Duce Advises Franco To Use 'Moderation' In Bombing of Ships

Rome, June 29.—(AP)—A spokesman for the Fascist regime declared today that the bombings were fully justified and asserted that "moderation" in his efforts to prevent British and other foreign ships from bringing supplies to government Spain.

The spokesman, the noted editor Virginio Gayda, said, however, that Italy approved of the bombing of the British merchant ships, but disclaimed any Italian responsibility therefor.

In an inspired article in the Giornale D'Italia, Gayda disclosed the content of the conversation last night between the Earl of Perth, Britain's ambassador, and Foreign Minister Count Galeazzo Ciano.

The editor said Ciano told Lord Perth that Franco "already had taken a series of measures to give the British government satisfaction with regard to the long list of bombings of British ships, against which London has protested vigorously."

These measures, Gayda said, were:

First, Franco had given orders that British ships should not be attacked while navigating.

Second, he had ordered that the British flag be respected as far as possible in Spanish government ports.

Third, Franco was willing to name free ports in western Spain (insurgent-held) where "hostile" traffic would have free entry.

Gayda said the bombings were fully justified and asserted that "moderation" in his efforts to prevent British and other foreign ships from bringing supplies to government Spain.

The rule that "no hostile" merchandise certainly can not go to a struggle which has its own life and fortune of an entire nation.

The Fascist spokesman denied that Lord Perth had "menaced" Italy in any way or brought up the question of "Italian responsibility for the bombings."

No doubt, said Gayda, the British ambassador talked about Spanish affairs in plain words and "the Italian government to use its influence in persuading General Franco to change his aerial war policy."

Humors are Denied

Insinuations that Italy was directly responsible for the bombings were strongly denied. "The conduct of the war and employment of equipment must be left exclusively to the will and decision of the Spanish commander," Gayda wrote. Any interference from Italy, he said, would be "a violation of Spanish independence, which Italy respects and intends to respect."

NYE INCREASES HIS LEAD OVER GOVERNOR LANGER

U. S. Senator Ahead For G. O. P. Nomination In North Dakota Primaries; How Other Candidates Fare.

Fargo, N. D., June 29.—(AP)—U. S. Senator Gerald P. Nye increased his lead over Governor William Langer for the Republican Senatorial nomination to approximately 10,000 when he won a third of North Dakota's precincts in the primary election yesterday.

Lester L. Burdick and William Langer, North Dakota's Representatives in Congress, also seemed assured of renomination in the Republican column.

Burdick, endorsed by the Non-partisan League of which Langer is the titular head, and Langer, were maintaining favorable leads for congressional posts in a six-cornered contest.

Langer, who has served in Congress for 22 years, has a record of 775 of 2,200 precincts gave Langer 32,410; Nye 47,740.

Robot Weather Observers For North and South Poles

Ottawa, June 29.—Establishment of automatic robot weather observers at the North and South Poles, announced today by the Canadian government, will be a central feature of the expedition to all parts of the world.

DESTROYERS DEPART SUDDENLY FROM GIBRALTAR FOR ITALIAN AIRPLANE BASE; BELIEVED A WARNING GESTURE TO STOP ATTACK ON STEAMERS.

London, June 29.—(AP)—Two British destroyers, the Imogen and the Isis, were ordered suddenly to Mallorca today from Gibraltar.

The Admiralty described the movement as "routine" in connection with the Nyon anti-aircraft patrol.

The Italian-operated airplane base at Palma, Mallorca, is the source of many of the insurgent air raids on the coast of government Spain and British shipping in Spanish waters. Mallorca is 150 miles east of Spain.

May Halt Attacks

Observers connected the movement of the destroyers with reports from Rome that Premier Mussolini had interceded with insurgent Generalissimo Francisco Franco in an effort to halt attacks on British vessels.

Both Mussolini's action and the Admiralty's were believed to be results of increasing pressure on Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain to do something to stop the attacks.

While warships are privileged to call at Mallorca at any time it was believed the present movement was the nature of a "gesture" to command the insurgents' attention and at the same time quiet opposition in Parliament.

Opposition members of Parliament have been getting more and more sarcastic in asking where the British Navy was while ships flying the Union Jack were being sunk. Chamberlain was heckled by the opposition again at today's session of the House of Commons.

At first he refused to name countries from which danger of war might arise if Britain used force against Franco to protect British ships and sailors.

"Then he said he had 'seen no reports' that the British government was making representations to Mussolini over the bombings."

Major Clement R. Attlee, Labor leader, said:

"Briefly the prime minister can answer as a matter of fact whether representations are being made in connection with the British ships and sailors."

There were derisive hoots from the Labor benches and a cry, "A Prime Minister!"

Pressure Increased.

Repeated bombings yesterday of Spanish government ports, where mounting damage to British shipping has inflamed a large section of British public opinion, put pressure on Chamberlain to find a solution of the war of a means of stopping the attacks.

As a chief supporter of insurgent General Franco, Mussolini was believed here to be in a position to influence the Burgos government to stop its attacks on British merchant ships, or to consider mediation efforts.

Attacks May Cease.

Advisers from Rome said it was believed the attacks might cease as a result of the conference because Mussolini wants to smooth the way for Prime Minister Chamberlain at home and wants the Anglo-Italian Easter pact made effective as soon as possible. The friendship treaty does not become operative until a "settlement" is reached in Spain.

French radio news yesterday did not help clear the storm clouds.

These radio news, which came less than 24 hours after the Spanish government announced it was holding its own in its threat to retaliate, perhaps on Italian ships, until it could see the effect of a neutral commission instituted to investigate whether bombings of civilians were justified by military objectives.

It was expected the commission would be ready to function at Toulouse, France, by the end of this week but Paris dispatches said an unexpected snag had been encountered in the refusal of Sweden to participate.

Official quarters in Stockholm refused to comment, but observers there were of the opinion that the decision was not definite. Sweden's refusal was said to have been based on the failure to get the United Nations.
