BUDGE, AUSTIN IN 'WIMBLEDON FINAL'

Champion Denies He Will Enter Pro Ranks In The Autumn.

Wimbledon, Eng., June 30.—(AP)—Don Budge, an unchallenged champion, makes what probably is his final appearance on the center court at Wimbledon tomorrow in the singles final with Bunny Austin. Though he is loud in his denials, Wimbledon is convinced Budge will turn professional after the Davis cup matches and the United States Championship this fall.

He'll get a hero's farewell when he walks off with the Challenge Cup early tomorrow evening. "Everywhere it is recognized that the match is more a case of 'when-then'."

"I wish it," said Budge. "No man in the past fortnight has been able to take a set from him. All he has had only 45 games in six matches and the most anyone has been able to take has been eight."

This record, despite Austin's excellent form in the semi-final yesterday, has put Budge at the unprecedented and forbidding odds of 1 to 10 to win.

It is significant of Budge's position in the tennis world that the man who was seeded next to him and who has had only 45 games in ten years has been able to take his set.

Nevertheless, he insists, "I am not in the least interested in turning professional at the moment. But I am not saying when his interest may pick up."

Certainly he hopes to get any competitors at all he'll have to turn professional. Budge, who has won the professional ranks, admits that he is not in the current tournament considered worthy of giving him a game, and he certainly has demonstrated in the past year that he is master of them all.

Modern Wimbledon has no parallel to Budge's position this year. He has been so outstanding he actually has been ignored. Practically every one on this same center court in the concluding match of the Davis cup Challenge round in 1937, Philadelphia, Tommy Kiste, 117, the United States already had taken the cup and Austin and Budge set out to enjoy their drinks in a middle court, to play tennis, to drink tea at 147, Toronto, outpointed Angie Herrick, 148, New York, 181.

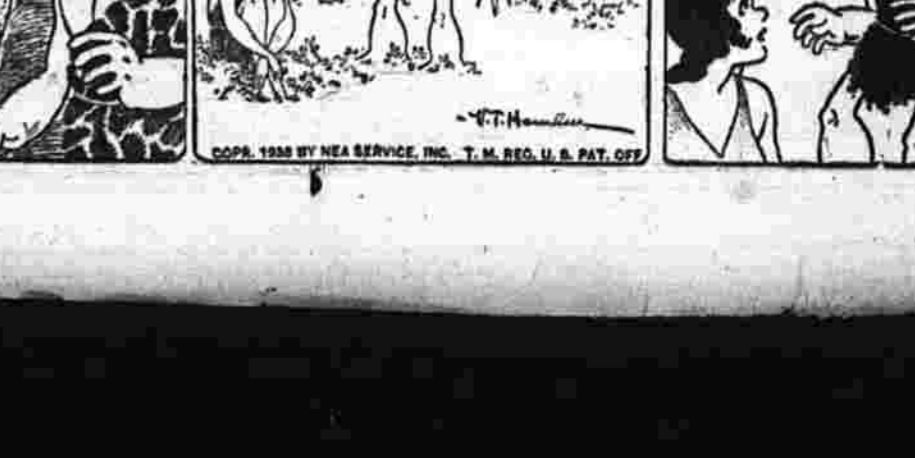
