NEW RIOTS FLARE IN HOLY LAND AS SOLDIERS POUR IN

Bomb Hurled At Bus in Jerusalem Kills Four Arabs And Wounds Thirty-Six; Warship Arrives At Haifa

Jerusalem, July 8.—(AP)—A bomb hurled at a bus today killed four Arabs and wounded 36 in a new outbreak of deadly terror which Great Britain is trying to crush with warships and troop reinforcements.

The bomb tore apart a bus in the crowded Arab bus station and vegetable market in the shadow of David's Tower.

The vehicle was filled with Arab countryfolk about to leave for Hebron. Its bloody and twisted framework was scattered in a roadway filled with panic-stricken humanity.

Troops of the Scottish Black Watch regiment with gleaming fixed bayonets cleared the square and started hunting the bomb thrower.

One Jew surrounded by an enraged Arab mob was rescued by police and hurried to safety.

About the same time a general strike broke out in Amman, in neighboring Transjordan. Workers struck in sympathy with Palestine Arabs, victims of bomb throwing at Haifa, Palestine's chief port.

Today's violence raised the casualties in nine days of riot and tension to 57 killed and 150 injured.

The British battle cruiser Repulse, one of the world's biggest battleships, sailed into Haifa harbor to take the place of the 7,500-ton British cruiser Emerald. The Repulse trained her cannon on Haifa.

British troops and marines patrolled Haifa, into which Arabs were pouring for refuge.

One Jewish store in Haifa was burned down. Three Jews were seriously injured when a car was set on fire by a mob.

Two battalions of British troops of British troops rushed from Egypt to reinforce the 10,000 British soldiers, armed police, and aviators who had fallen to halt the riot.

PLANE'S CRASH KILLS 1, HURTS 7, 5 SLIGHTLY

Most Of Northwest Liner's Passengers Escape With Minor Injuries As The Plane Falls In Take-Off

Billings, Mont., July 8.—(AP)—A Northwest Airlines transport plane carrying eight passengers and a crew of two crashed at the end of the field while taking off here early today, killing one person and injuring seven. Mrs. N. B. Mackay, Francon, Ill. died at St. Vincent's Hospital in Billings shortly after the crash. The hospital announced, Her husband was taken to the hospital but the extent of his injuries was not known.

Mrs. W. J. Tisdale, Sloan, B. C., also was being treated at the hospital, but attendants said they did not know whether she was seriously hurt.

SUSPECT FARMHAND IN TRIPLE MURDER

Newly Married Couple And Their Hired Man Found Slain In Their Home.

Ossau, Minn., July 8.—(AP)—Three persons lay dead today—a newly married young couple and a hired man—victims of a triple murder which took place in their home yesterday.

The three bodies were found late yesterday, about 12 hours after the time authorities estimated they had been slain.

The dead are Kenneth Oswald, 24; his wife, Paula, 24, and John Kujawa, 25.

Deputy Sheriff Fred Kraemer said a former farm hand with whom the Oswalds had had trouble recently was being sought for questioning.

Shortly after the bodies were found it was discovered that a large dog, which had been kept in the house, was missing.

Neighbors reported they heard the truck start away from the Oswald home about 5 a. m. yesterday. The abandoned truck was found last night in Minneapolis and authorities searched for fingerprints.

Father Finds Bodily

Charles Oswald, father of Kenneth, discovered the bodies at 9 p. m. yesterday when he went to his son's home after he was unable to obtain an answer by telephone.

As he entered the dining room, he found dishes and glasses on the table, just as they had been left after a family party had broken up on the night before.

He then opened the door of the bedroom, just off the dining room, and there he found the bodies of the young couple who were married last September and were lying on the bed. Both had been shot through the head, apparently as they slept. There was no sign of a struggle.

Kujawa's body was found in an upstairs bedroom. He too was lying on a bed, shot through the head.

Andrew Zlot, bookkeeper at the Farmers Union Livestock Commission at South St. Paul, gave a possible clue to the authorities.

He said a man, answering the former farm hand's description, brought in two cows and sold them for \$143.

Authorities said the former farm hand had been released by the Oswalds June 20 after serving a 30 day term for forgery.

CITIZENS MAY ACT IN MAYTAG STRIKE

Offer Sheriff A Force Of 1,000 Men To Keep Order If Any Trouble Occurs.

Newton, Ia., July 8.—(AP)—While Governor Nelson G. Kravich stood pat on his assertion for Federal government today and he said "benefit of the public," a picketed group of Jasper county business men and farmers sought today to organize 1,000 deputy sheriffs to "restore and maintain law and order" in connection with a month-old Maytag Company labor controversy here.

"If I take over law enforcement in Newton, I will, under no circumstances, do so to open the picketing to the safety board created by the C. I. O. union," the governor announced in Des Moines.

The governor's announcement came shortly after the 40 business men and farmers made public the following resolution:

"Resolved: That the sheriff of Jasper county immediately organize and deputize a force of 1,000 men or such number as he may deem sufficient to restore and maintain law and order in the city of Newton and Jasper county, and to hereby offer him our services and co-operation in the organization of such force."

Sheriff Rhoads, informed of the group's action, stated:

"We simply do not have a large enough force to restore and maintain law and order in the city of Newton. I will follow the situation. I'm of the opinion I'll follow the law and the sheriff's duty as a business man."

NEW INSECT DEVELOPED BY WESTERN BIOLOGIST

Palo Alto, Calif., July 7.—(AP)—A winged chrysalis, a new insect half chrysalis and half butterfly, has come from the biological test tubes of Stanford University here.

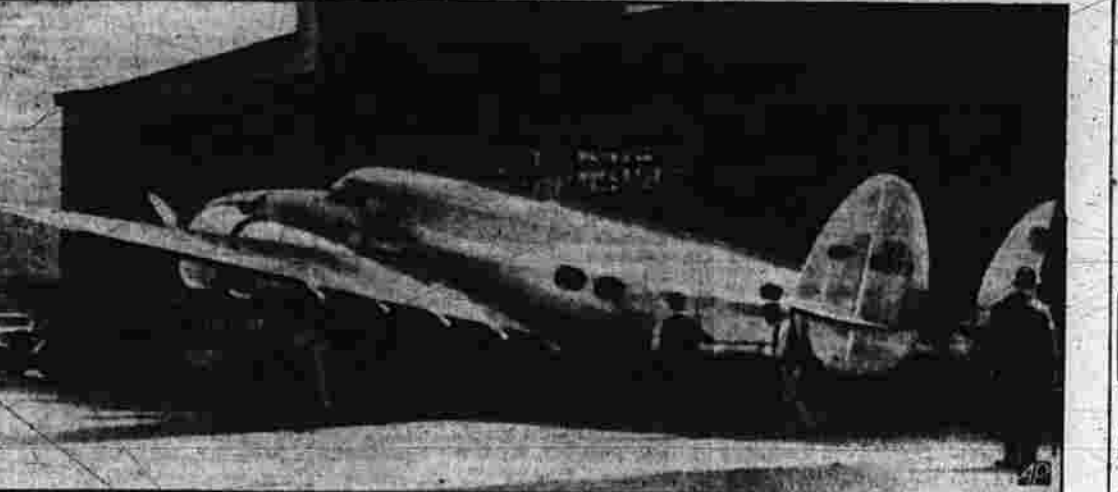
With head and wings of a butterfly but the body of a chrysalis, this creature arises from the discovery of what causes the summer chrysalis to change into a butterfly.

The discovery was made by Dietrich Bodestein, research assistant in the School of Biology.

The cause is a chemical in the chrysalis' head. The chemical acts like a hormone, the ductless gland secretion which "makes a man what he is." Insects, although said to be immune to possession by hormones, sometimes are not.

Bodestein says the metamorphosis may be hormonal, but he does not know if it is a nervous stimulus, or travels through the chrysalis' skin.

NEVILLS PARTY IS FOUND SAFE BY U. S. FLIERS

Coast Guard Aviators Discover Colorado River Explorers Canyon's Halfway Point.

Lee's Ferry, Ariz., July 8.—(AP)—Out of dangerous water, the reported Nevills expedition was recovered 20 miles up the Colorado river here today ready to surge into Lee's Ferry and their first contact with civilization in 18 dramatic days.

Two Coast Guard aviators, supported by a six-member scientific expedition under the leadership of Edward J. Noble of Greenfield, Conn., were sighted by the group apparently headed by the Nevills.

The Nevills, R. W. Fendley and L. Riggs, reporting to the Coast Guard's Bureau of Air Commerce and the air mail bureau of the Interstate Commerce Commission for the Nevada expedition, said that they had not seen the Nevills since they were sighted at Lee's Ferry.
