

CHINESE RENEW 'SCORCH POLICY' AT KIUKIANG

Shanghai, July 12. (AP) — Japanese bombers raided Chinese positions on the outskirts of Kiukiang today while Chinese defenders prepared to fight to a finish and, intending to leave nothing valuable behind, systematically destroyed buildings, waterworks, and other property.

Reports from British companies indicated the Chinese were determined to resist every means to compel a Japanese landing at Kiukiang. The Japanese also said Chinese decided to destroy river-front property of the Standard Oil Company because of military necessity.

Within Three Miles The Japanese were reported within three miles of Kiukiang. While the invaders' land forces were fighting hard to advance, Japanese units were said to have entered the head of the Yangtze river in the area of Kiukiang.

As the invaders pushed closer, the evacuation of foreigners proceeded hurriedly. The British gunboat Cordoba and the steamer Wenchow took some 500 persons to safety.

MAY NOT NAME JUSTICE UNTIL '1939 CONGRESS

Washington, July 12. (AP) — The possibility that President Roosevelt might delay selection of a new Supreme Court Justice until Congress meets in January was considered today by Capitol politicians.

The Rutledge Case John Rutledge of South Carolina, who had resigned as associate justice of the Supreme Court to become chief justice of his state's highest court, was appointed chief justice of the United States by President Washington in 1795.

Two other justices took their seats while Congress was in recess, and four weeks later were confirmed by the Senate.
