

### SAMUEL INSULL DIES FROM HEART STROKE IN A PARIS SUBWAY

Former Utilities Magnate Who Built A Financial Empire In The Midwest Dies In Subway Train.

Paris, July 16.—(AP)—Samuel Insull, 78, fallen \$4,000,000,000 ruler of Midwest Utilities empire, died suddenly early this afternoon.

Officials said he collapsed from a heart attack in a subway train. Insull was taken by subway employees to the nearby "Paul Marquet" emergency hospital in the 10th district.

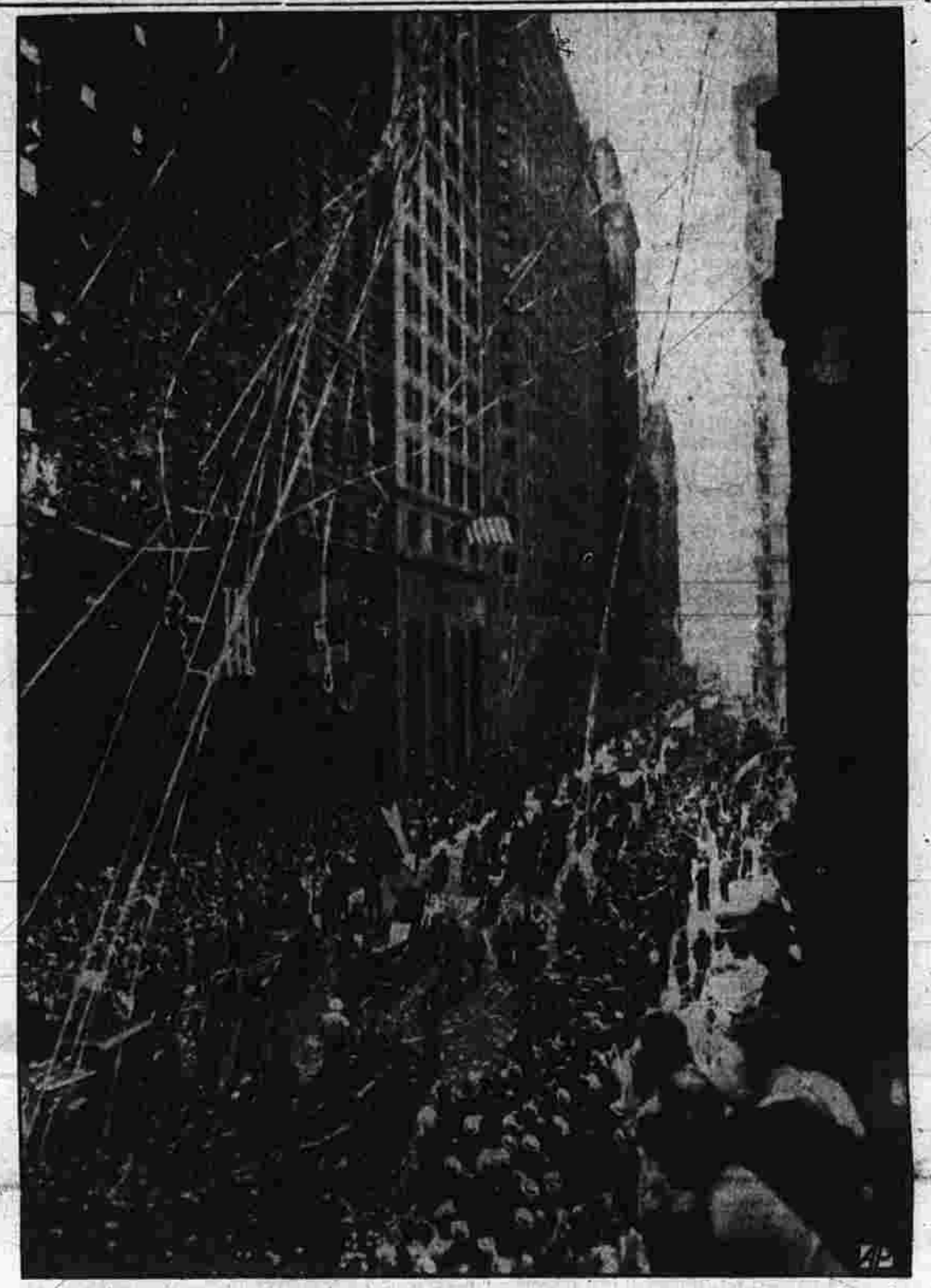
Mrs. Insull, in a state of collapse when she reached the hospital, said that when she left their hotel apartment at noon the aging magnate told her he was going to write a few letters and then go to lunch.

He was charged with using the mails to defraud and violation of the Bankruptcy Act.

While steps to return him were in progress, the power baron fled to Italy—thence to Greece and Turkey—but eventually was seized and brought back to the United States.
