

QUEEN MARIE DIES IN HER 63RD YEAR; HAD BEEN LONG ILL

Dowager Queen of Rumania Who Directed Destinies Of Her Country For A Generation Passes Away.

Bucharest, July 14.—(AP)—Dowager Queen Marie of Rumania, who helped shape the destiny of her country for a generation, died today in her 63rd year.

The Queen mother, famed for her beauty, died at her palace at Sinaia, the royal summer residence, at 8:30 P. M. (12:25 a. m. e. s. t.).

Prime Minister Miron Cristea, who also is patriarch of the Rumanian Orthodox church, presided over the funeral service in the palace immediately after her passing. Thereafter, she was buried in the royal mausoleum at the death scene.

Her death came, however, immediately after a long illness.

Queen Marie, who died at 73, was born in Prussia and lived in Rumania for 30 years. She had three children: King Carol II, Queen Elizabeth and King George II.
