

MILLION VOTE IN TEXAS AFTER BALLOT CIRCUS

Radio Talker, New To Politics, With Sound Truck And Hillbilly Band, Big Figure In Governor Race.

Austin, Tex., July 23.—(AP)—A million citizens stepped into balloting booths today for a showdown on the most unpredictable issue in Texas political history—the potency of mountain music.

The new personality, W. Lee O'Daniel, converted the campaign into a traveling circus. The Fort Worth four broke camp today at a sound truck with a blaring hillbilly band and a promise of \$20 monthly per diem for the aged—whether they be millionaires or indigent.

O'Daniel's Opponents Never has the Democratic primary field bulged with such strength. O'Daniel's chief opponents are Attorney General William McCraw who was re-elected without opposition four years ago, Railroad Commissioner Ernest O. Thompson, proponent of low utility rates, and Tom Hunter, Wichita Falls oil man and three-time candidate who never has polled less than 200,000 votes.

O'Daniel pecked away at the "professional politicians" in his closing speech last night and asserted he favored the working man. McCraw said he hoped Texas would declare an end to petty quarreling and sordid politics. Thompson renewed his pledge to industrialize the state, and Hunter said he was eager to slice \$15,000,000 from the state budget.

Eight others, including Karl A. Vowles, former solicitor for the postoffice department and James A. Ferguson of Bell county, kin of former Jim Fisk, cut the seven-voted gubernatorial aspirants.

Eight weeks ago O'Daniel was unknown to politics—but a household name to rural radio listeners who, for a decade, had heard his informal chats on a commercial four program.

HAD RIGHT TO FIRE SIT-DOWN STRIKERS

Federal Court Rules Workers Discharged By Fansteel Co., Had No Status.

Chicago, July 23.—(AP)—A federal court ruling that an employer may discharge workers who seize property in sit-down strikes appeared here today for Supreme Court review. The decision was rendered last night by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals. It set aside a National Labor Relations board order finding the Fansteel Metallurgical Corporation guilty of unfair labor practices and directing the reinstatement of 92 men discharged Feb. 7, 1937, when they occupied the company's North Chicago plant.

Belief was expressed in informed Washington quarters that the board would appeal. Charles Fahy, general counsel for the NLRB, commented "the reasoning of the board was correct, that of the majority of the court was incorrect."

The three had been expected to arrive shortly at Billings and Lovelltown, Mont., to visit sisters of the Great Flood. Concern for their safety was expressed there by relatives, who had received a postcard from them, mailed at Albuquerque, Tuesday.

Head Of Republic Steel Subpoenaed To Testify At Civil Liberties Inquiry.

Washington, July 23.—(AP)—Chairman La Follette (Prog. Wle.) said today a Senate Civil Liberties committee had subpoenaed Tom Girdler, chairman of Republic Steel Corporation, in connection with its investigation of the "Little Steel" strike.

La Follette said Girdler would be summoned today for additional testimony about difficulties union or labor relations had for six steel companies of the union which sought collective bargaining rights.

JAPS TAKE OFF IN LONG WAITED KIUKIANG PUSH

Begin Naval And Land Assault After Crossing Lake Entrance; Chinese Guerrillas Busy In Shansi.

Shanghai, July 23.—(AP)—Japanese naval and land forces began a long-awaited assault today on Kiukiang, key point in the push toward Hankow. A Japanese naval communiqué announced that landings were effected at several points on the southern shore of the Yangtsze river, putting the invaders within ten miles of Kiukiang, 133 miles down the Yangtsze to the Chinese provincial capital.

These developments followed by a few minutes the Japanese success in crossing the narrow entrance to Poyang lake, ten miles east of Kiukiang, after three weeks of terrific bombardments. The Japanese thus gained a favored position for a drive against the big Nanchang air base.

The communiqué said Japanese aviators intensively bombed Chinese towns and villages on the Yangtsze's south bank while other forces machine-gunned Chinese forces attempting to halt the Japanese infantry.

Table To Street Trenches Kiukiang's defense had been badly shattered by repeated raids and the Chinese fighters remaining in the city took positions in street trenches and a building. They awaited the approach of 8,000 Japanese troops at nearby Hsiang.

Severe fighting was progressing, meanwhile, throughout Shansi province. Chinese reported the Japanese were unable to perfect their organization for a projected offensive across the Yellow River against Tungkuang and Lyaning, considered the gateways to Shensi province, Communist stronghold.

Chinese troops attacked Japanese and transports all along the Yellow, aided by heavy rain. Further north the Chinese also claimed success in impeding several members of the fraternity of the Tall Cedars of Lebanon gathered here to help Nutmeg Forest of this town and Quibehang Valley Forest of Moosup to observe their tenth anniversary.

A parade is scheduled for 6:30 this evening, but if the rain does not stop by that time the parade will be abandoned. The Tall Cedars still wear expatriate uniforms and they will not risk them in a downpour.

URGES NEW PACTS WITH REPUBLICS

Sen. Pittman Declares They Will Eliminate Trouble Experienced With Mexico

Washington, July 23.—(AP)—Chairman Pittman (D. Nev.) of the Senate Foreign Relations committee proposed today that the United States seek new commercial treaties with all the American Republics.

These agreements, the Senator said, should stimulate in the new difficulties such as those now existing in Mexico, which he said should be eliminated by arbitration.

Pittman interpreted it as embracing "a preference for the better relations with the American Republics. He said he had no doubt that the United States would bring up these matters at a meeting in Lima in December of representatives of all American Republics."

Rep. Gurnea, who introduced the measure, said it was "a step toward the elimination of the difficulties which both Russia and Manchukuo have experienced."

REICH SEEKS PEACEFUL SOLUTION OF CZECHS' DISPUTE, BRITAIN TOLD

New Accord Now Seen, Britain and Germany

Berlin, July 23.—(AP)—Hopes of an ultimate understanding between Germany and Great Britain were nursed in official German quarters today as the result of King George VI's state visit to France this week were studied.

The optimism was based on a realization that both Britain and France seemed determined to make clear to the Czechoslovak government that far-reaching concessions to its clamorous autonomy-seeking minorities were essential.

Some newspapers emphasized this fact as a surprising action in connection with the royal visit.

Political circles wondered what point out, however, that unless the Sudeten Germans are satisfied there is likely to be an explosion.

Some German circles believe Great Britain will be willing to leave to the autonomy-seeking Nazi-supported German Sudeten their fight for such concessions as they can obtain.

JAPANESE-SOVIET CLASH REPORTED BY MOSCOW

Jap Motorboats Cross Border Shots Follow; 2 Soldiers Wounded In Encounter.

Moscow, July 23.—(AP)—Reports of a Japanese-Soviet clash and a Japanese landing on the Soviet island Falngow renewed Far Eastern tension today just as it was subsiding after a Japanese protest that Soviet troops had violated the Manchukuoan frontier July 11.

Displaces from Khabarovsk, Siberian city near the Manchukuoan border, said two Japanese-Manchukuoan motorboats violated the Soviet frontier near the settlement of Vitovoq on Thursday and landed a military detachment on Falngow. Soon afterwards, the reports said, a Soviet cutter passing the island was fired upon and a brisk exchange of bullets followed, resulting in the wounding of two Japanese Manchukuoan soldiers and the capture of one machine-gun, five Japanese rifles and a quantity of ammunition.

The encounter, said Tass (Russian News Agency), occurred on the Ussuri river, north of the Changkai-feng district—near where Siberia, Japanese Korea and Manchukuoan borders meet. Japanese soldiers on July 11 occupied a piece of land on the island which had been good in their possession.

Premier Chamberlain Declares His Country Will Assist In Finding A Solution Of The Sudeten German Minority Dispute.

London, July 23.—(AP)—Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain was disclosed authoritatively today to have given the German ambassador "certain assurances" of continued British efforts in Czechoslovakia for solution of the Sudeten German minority dispute.

A semi-official account of yesterday's interview between the premier and Ambassador Dr. Herbert von Dirksen before the latter left for Germany said, however, "no concrete proposals were made on either side nor was any suggestion under discussion."

It was stated that "in the course of a friendly conversation before going on leave, the German ambassador gave the premier assurance of Germany's peaceful intentions and the desire of his government to seek an amicable and satisfactory solution of the Sudeten German question."

In return, it was added, the premier minister on his side gave the German ambassador certain assurances regarding the continued exercise of his Majesty's government of their good offices in France.

German assurances of the desire for closed Anglo-German relations were interpreted as a promise that Britain would actively press the Czechoslovak government to complete its minority statute as quickly as possible and go as far as it could in meeting the Sudeten German autonomy and other demands.

It was considered likely, too, that the Japanese-French pact would be given the Sudeten full opportunity to negotiate on professional conditions before presenting them to Parliament.

Some quarters close to the London government mentioned the possibility of a non-aggression pact among France, Soviet Russia and Germany as a possible way out of a middle arising from self-government demands of Nazi-supported Sudeten Germans in Czechoslovakia.

Another suggestion was that Germany might approve a four-power plan involving France, Germany, Britain and Italy to work out a solution.

But another was a reported German willingness to enter immediately a non-aggression pact with Czechoslovakia if the Sudeten problem could be answered.
