Washington, July 27.-(AP) -Electioneering House members, whose campaigns generally have been overshadowed by senatorial races, are in the midst of some hot

primary battles of their own.

A number of anti-administration Democrats, including a few members of the House rules committee, are encountering stiff opposition from pro-Roosevelt candidates. Some of the President's ardent supporters also are having their troubles.

Labor's Nonpartisan league, political arm of the C. I. O., is leading the assault against the rules committee bloc that held up action on wage-hour legislation for months.

The league included six rules committee Democrats in a blacklist of House members whose records, it said, called for opposition from labor. Two of these, Clark of North Carolina and Dies of Texas, already have obtained renomination. A third, Lewis, of Colorado, was chosen by a district Democratic assembly for renomination without oppo-

Two others, Smith of Virginia and Cox of Georgia, are under fire from candidates who are making an issue of administration support. The sixth, driver of Arkansas, is opposed by State Senator E. C. Gathings, but the Roosevelt administration is not an issue.

Cox is opposed by W. Jewel Crowe, who is campaigning as a supporter of New Deal objectives. Cox has voted against the administration on several occasions, and was one of the leaders in the fight against the wage-hour bill.
