

On July 12 President Roosevelt announced to the nation that a \$4,000,000,000 deficit was probable for the Federal government's 1938-1939 financial year. At the same time, he revealed that the latest deficit promised to carry our national debt over the \$40,000,000 mark for the fast time in history. Since 1929 our Federal debt has been increased by the tremendous amount of \$24,000,000,000.






